# 24 Hours with the Lord: March 19th - 20th

As we have done in the past, we'll be organizing a 24 Hours with the Lord (Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament) from conclusion of 8:30am Mass on Tuesday, March 19 until Wednesday, March 20 at 8:00am. There are many reasons why this

type of prayer experience is beneficial:

- Amid our Eucharistic Revival Year, another privileged opportunity to be before the Blessed Sacrament in prayer and contemplation.
- Lent is a time of prayer and reflection...what better place to enter more fully into that most worthy of endeavors than before the Lord in Exposition.
- March 19<sup>th</sup> is also the Solemnity of St. Joseph, husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary. In Joseph, with his relationship to Mary as husband and Jesus as an earthly Father, we have the prime example of a man who exemplifies duty, faith, prayer and sacrifice.
- From 6:30pm 8:00pm we will offer God's forgiveness through the sacrament of Reconciliation. Several priests will be present.
- Every hour on the hour, a devotion or preaching will occur. Each of hour of the twenty-four will offer a unique way to give praise, worship and glory to God.
- Come for an hour, twenty minutes, or half the day.
   Come for prayer, confession or both. Come to be with the Lord and pray for peace in the world, an increase of priestly and religious vocations, conversion of hearts, forgiveness of sins and whatever is on your heart. God will listen!

# Fourth Sunday 'Laetare' of Lent

"The fourth Sunday of Lent called *Laetare* Sunday. *Laetare* is a Latin word that means "rejoice." Traditionally, Sundays are named after the first word of the liturgy's opening antiphon. On this Sunday, the antiphon is taken from the book of the prophet Isaiah (Isaiah 66:10-11). Even as we observe our Lenten sacrifices, we rejoice in anticipation of the joy that will be ours at Easter.

Today's Gospel reading is taken from John's Gospel. It consists of two parts. The first part is the final sentence of Jesus' reply to Nicodemus, the Pharisee who approached Jesus at night. Nicodemus acknowledged Jesus as someone who had come from God and seemed to want to be a follower of Jesus. Jesus greeted Nicodemus with the observation that one must be born from above to see the Kingdom of God. The dialogue between Jesus and Nicodemus that followed was about the meaning of this

phrase. Nicodemus misunderstood Jesus at every point, but there was no animosity in the questions he posed to Jesus.

In the part of the conversation with Nicodemus in today's Gospel, Jesus referred to an incident reported in the Old Testament. When the Israelites grumbled against the Lord during their sojourn in the desert, God sent venomous serpents to punish them for their complaints. The Israelites repented and asked Moses to pray for them. The Lord heard Moses' prayer and instructed him to make a bronze serpent and mount it on a pole. All who had been bitten by a serpent and then looked upon the bronze serpent were cured. By recalling this story, Jesus alludes to the salvation that would be accomplished through his death and Resurrection.

The second part of today's Gospel is a theological reflection on Jesus' words to Nicodemus. The Gospel of John is known for this kind of reflection offered within the narrative. In these reflections, John elaborates on a number of themes that are found in his Gospel: light and darkness, belief and unbelief, good and evil, salvation and condemnation.

In John's reflection, we find an observation about human sinfulness. Jesus is the light that has come into the world, but people preferred the darkness. We wish to keep our sins hidden, even from God. Jesus has come into the world to reveal our sins so that they may be forgiven. This is the Good News; it is the reason for our rejoicing in this season of Lent and throughout our lives". (loyolapress.com)





A cart will be left in the hallway outside the office door for drop off.




