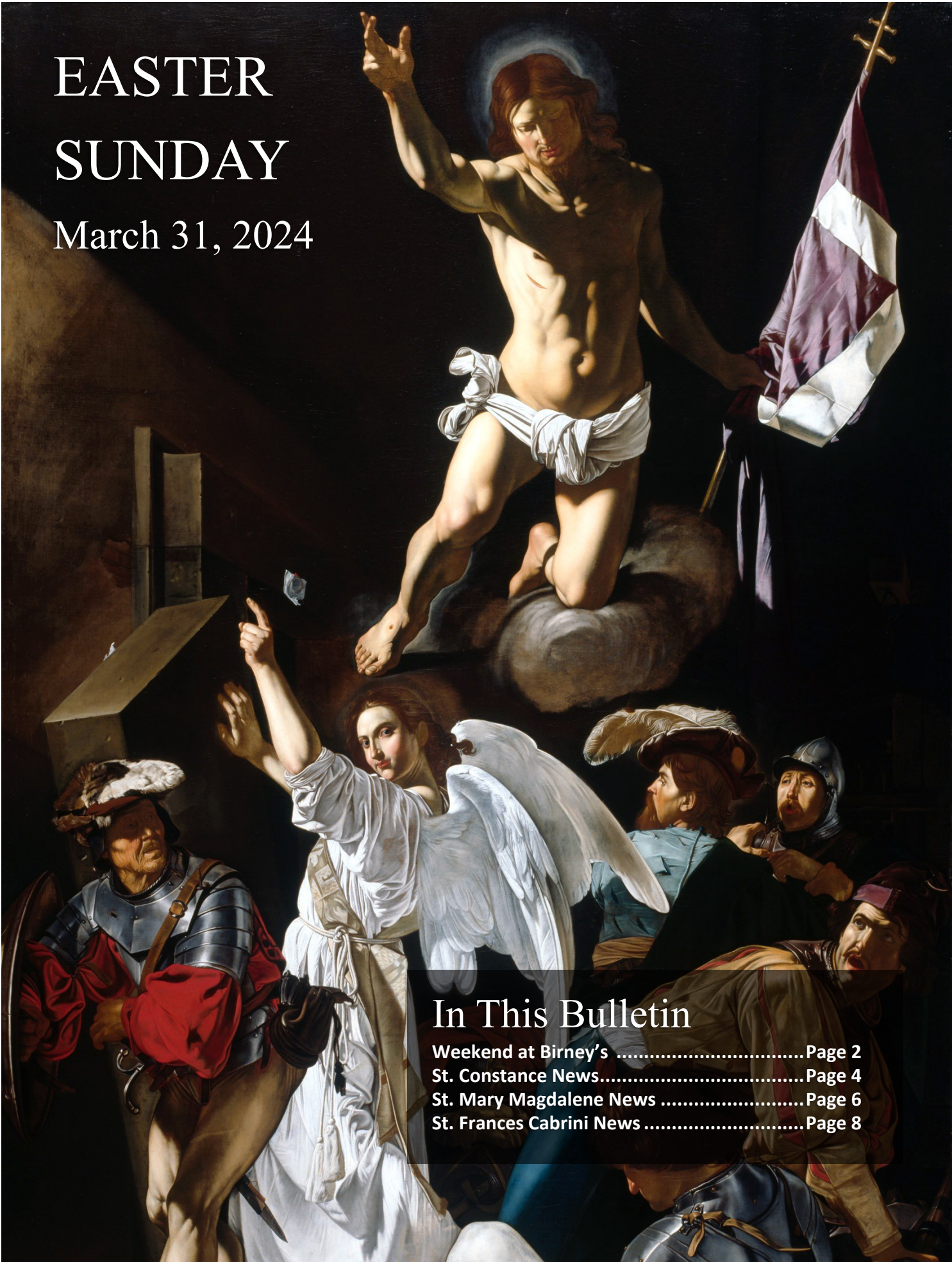

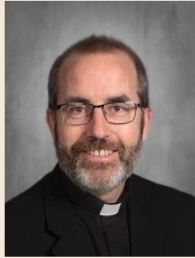

Weekend at Birney's



Happy Easter!

We began our Lenten journey with a recognition of our sinfulness on Ash Wednesday... 'turn away from sin and follow the Gospel.' We followed Jesus as we accepted His invitation to take up our cross through acts of prayer, penance, and sacrifice, so that we might more wholeheartedly follow Him.

We were with Jesus as He triumphantly entered Jerusalem on Palm Sunday...on Holy Thursday when He bent low and washed our feet to prepare us for reception of His Body & Blood in the Eucharist...on Good Friday when He endured the humiliation and passion of the Cross to provide for us a path towards salvation. Having sat at the table with Him and having stood at the cross with Him, we can now stand at the empty tomb and proclaim, with Mary Magdalene, Peter and John, *Jesus is Risen!* Death did not have the final word. Light has overcome darkness; new and everlasting life is offered to all people.

Today, on Easter Sunday we stand with Mary Magdalene and the Apostles at the empty tomb. Mary was a loyal and faithful disciple of Jesus as He preached to the crowds and healed the sick. She, with the other women, stood at the cross and watched her Savior die a very public and brutally painful death. Now after His death and burial, she is still looking for Him. Imagine her surprise and shock when she saw that the huge stone that covered the tomb was rolled away. Imagine her shock and disappointment when she saw that the tomb was empty.

Today, we are called to follow Mary's example; we too are asked to go and tell, to go and share the Good News of our faith with others. Like the first to witness the empty tomb, like St. Constance, St. Frances Cabrini, SS. Andrew & Benedict and Blessed Solanus Casey, we too are called to be missionary disciples who share and proclaim the Good News of the resurrection with all those we meet. We do this in countless ordinary ways through the devout practice of the faith as revealed to us through the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Mary and the first Apostles experienced the resurrection in a very personal way and then went and gave witness of what they beheld. Pope Francis, in his letter 'The Joy of the Gospel' says to each of us, *every Christian is a missionary to the extent that that they have experienced the love of God in Christ.*

Today, as we celebrate and experience the Resurrection of Jesus anew, let us go and share with others this incredible, inexhaustible, unrepeatable, Good News; Jesus is risen, death is defeated, light and goodness has triumphed. Jesus is truly risen and alleluia is our eternal song! Happy Easter!

I know change can pose many challenges. Familiar routines get uprooted, comfort levels tested, the 'look and feel'... 'looks and feels' unfamiliar. For some, questions of: 'what was wrong with the former way?' or 'why was this necessary?' are naturally spoken. Opinions of...I like the old version better....I love the changes...I can't find 'my' section...will no doubt be shared. My former spiritual director in the seminary, Msgr. John Zenz, would often remind me that 'change is part of the DNA of a healthy spiritual life'. As it is for the spiritual life, so it is with 'real life'. I pray that as we continue to grow in our understanding and practice of being reorganized into a 'Family of Parishes' ---**Quo Vadis Domine**—we will look for the ways that change can bestow new or unexpected blessings, graces still be celebrated, how positives can far outweigh negatives, and fully embrace that the mission stays the same, even though we are now approaching it in a new way. Appropriate to the great feast of Easter, this is very 'paschal' (*dying & rising*)...as we proudly and faithfully proclaim the 'paschal mystery' at the celebration of the Eucharist, let us live it out....in our parishes, through our ministries, with our new bulletin!

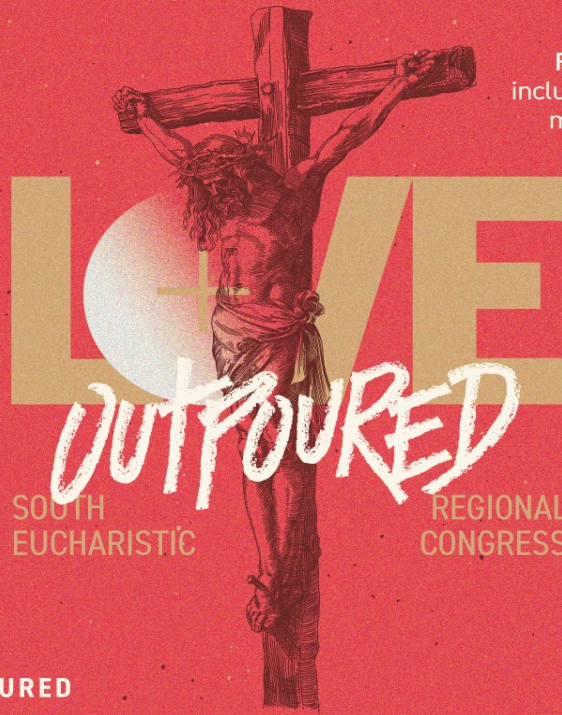
