As I have previously reported, we


have many significant sacramental celebrations to acknowledge for the youth of our parishes this past week and ahead. This is a continuing sign of God's abundant graces still flowing to the faithful amid the changes to parish life. Each sacrament we receive brings us back to a more intense examination of what occurred at baptism. At the time of baptism, every parent is asked by the minister right before the lifegiving waters are poured over the head of their child: 'Are you willing to raise your child in the practice of the faith, that we have professed with you today?' Only after an affirmative answer to that question, is the child baptized.

This first of several more to come, in what can best be described as 'pivotal sacramental moments' in our relationship with the Lord and His Church, take effect through the guidance and positive example of parents....at least they should be! The children of our parishes who were blessed to receive God's forgiveness through the sacrament of Reconciliation, the Body and Blood of God's Son through the sacrament of the Eucharist, the gifts of the Holy Spirit through the sacrament of Confirmation, did so because their parents brought them to catechism or to Cabrini school to be formed, intellectually and spiritually. I pray that this 'bringing them' to Church continues well beyond these sacramental moments and as promised at the time of baptism. As a community of faith, let us now offer our support for these young members of the parish, and their parents to also model what it looks like to 'practice the faith', what it sounds like 'to speak the faith' and what it feels like to 'live the faith'.

Fifth Sunday of Easter Reflection

"In John's Gospel, the Last Supper begins with Jesus washing his disciples' feet. Jesus then provides them with a series of instructions. In these chapters of John's Gospel, Jesus instructs his disciples about the importance of following his example of love and service, about the gift they will receive when Jesus sends them the Holy Spirit, and about their relationship with Jesus and with the world.

In his metaphor of the vine and the branches, Jesus is referencing the Hebrew Scriptures. In the Hebrew Scriptures, Israel is the vineyard, and Yahweh himself tends the vineyard.

In this passage, Jesus teaches his disciples that his relationship with them will not end after his death; he will remain with them always. This unity between Jesus and his disciples is the basis for their ability to continue to do the work that he began.

We come to know Jesus through the Scriptures, the

We come to know Jesus through the Scriptures, the living Word of God. Our commitment to be Christ's disciples is sustained through God's Word. This

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The season of First Communions is here, and invitations pour in as the new communicants, mostly seven years old, gather extended families for their first reception of the Eucharist. Recently, the celebrations are often on Sundays, in the regular gatherings of the faith community. There, it becomes clear that First Communion is meant to initiate a regular pattern of reception, and that there is to be a second, third, hundredth, thousandth celebration.

Eastern Catholics and Orthodox children follow a different plan, since they are given a taste of the consecrated wine at their baptism as infants. We Western Christians delay until "the age of reason," but many years ago, Communion was not for children at all. Twelve to fourteen was the typical time for Roman Catholics to receive for the first time, and in those days this was a transition into the adult world of work and marriage. The custom did not begin to shift to childhood until reforms set in place by Pope St. Pius X began to take hold in the 1920s. If you are going to a First Communion, you can give thanks that the table of the Lord is today open so much more lavishly than before.

Lift Up Your Hearts

We will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation with Bishop Hanchon presiding. This class of students has been in our Religious Education program for many years under the guidance of Ms. Roseanna Rogers, our Director of Religious Education . We have had a wonderful staff of teachers, so faithful and dedicated.

Confirmation is not an ending-point, but a turning point. As each person stands before the Bishop, with their sponsor's hand on their shoulder, the Bishop speaks the words of the Sacrament:

"BE SEALED WITH THE GIFT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT." The Bishop anoints with the Holy Oil of Sacred Chrism. The Gifts of the Holy Spirit will grow in each person: WIS-DOM, UNDERSTANDING, KNOWLEDGE, FORTITUDE, COUNSEL, PIETY, AND A HOLY FEAR OF THE LORD.

Our spiritual growth is not automatic in these virtues. It takes prayer daily, seriously talking with God, faithfully attending mass and receiving the Eucharist. And finally, don't forget the gift of the bible. It is important that we develop some habit of reading His Holy Word, that it will become a part of your life.

SAINT CATHERINE OF SIENA (1347-1380) April 29

Imagine the pope receiving a young woman still in her twenties who addresses him as "my sweet Christ on earth," then orders: "Get back to Rome where you belong!" Amazingly, Gregory XI complied! Yet this was but one astonishing incident in the extraordinary life of Catherine of Siena, a truly unique medieval woman. Youngest of twenty-five children, Catherine refused marriage and became a Dominican Tertiary at sixteen, cloistering herself at home in contemplative prayer, austere penances, and mystical experiences, culminating in "spiritual espousal" to Christ. Then, incarnating the Dominican ideal of "passing on to others the fruits of contemplation," Catherine left her solitude to care for the poor, nurse the sick, comfort the dying, and bury the dead. Increasingly renowned for converting souls and healing bodies, she was sought after to broker peace during civil wars and Church schisms. All this, and like Jesus, whom she called "my "Divine Spouse," she died at thirty-three! Four hundred letters and her spiritual classic *The Dialogue* inspired Paul VI to name her, together with Teresa of Ávila, the first women "doctors of the Church." —Peter Scagnelli


