

#### Happy Labor Day

"Labor Day pays tribute to the contributions and achievements of American workers and was created by the labor movement in the late 19th century and became a federal holiday in 1894. Labor Day originated during one of American labor history's most dismal chapters. In the late 1800s,

at the height of the Industrial Revolution in the United States, the average American worked 12-hour days and seven-day weeks in order to eke out a basic living. Despite restrictions in some states, children as young as 5 or 6 toiled in mills, factories and mines across the country, earning a fraction of their adult counterparts' wages.

People of all ages, particularly the very poor and recent immigrants, often faced extremely unsafe working conditions, with insufficient access to fresh air, sanitary facilities and breaks.

The idea of a "workingmen's holiday," celebrated on the first Monday in September, caught on in other industrial centers across the country, and many states passed legislation recognizing it. On June 28, 1894, President Grover Cleveland signed it into law." (history.com)

#### **Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time Reflection**

"In today's Gospel, Mark provides a significant amount of information about the Jewish observance of ritualpurity laws. Most scholars believe that Mark includes this information because his audience includes Gentile Christians who have no knowledge or experience of these laws. We can infer, therefore, that many in Mark's community were not Jewish Christians.

In this Gospel, Mark addresses the question of which Jewish practices would also be observed in the newly emerging Christian community. This was a significant question for the early Christian Church, especially in communities that included both Jewish and Gentile converts to Christianity. Jesus first criticizes the Pharisees for putting human tradition above God's Law. Here, Jesus is referring to the tradition of the elders, the teachings of the Pharisees, which extended the ritual-purity laws of Temple worship to everyday Jewish life. Jesus criticizes the Pharisees for making this tradition equal to and as binding as the Law of Moses.

Next, Jesus comments on the meaning behind the Pharisees' language of holiness—clean and unclean. Jesus teaches that a person is not defiled by the food that enters his or her body, but rather by sin that emerges from his or her words and actions. In this teaching, Jesus unmasks a deeper question behind the one posed to him by the Pharisees. The real issue is holiness, which is not found in external acts alone. Holiness comes from within and is evidenced in the actions and attitudes that emerge from a person's life.

Jesus' words challenge us as well. In our desire to show that we are holy, we might also give too much credence to externals, following rules without thinking about the intention behind them. Jesus reminds us that we do not make ourselves holy by our actions. Rather, we become holy when we allow God's Spirit to transform us. Our actions should be an expression of the conversion of our heart to God and to God's ways." (loyolapress.com)

### Lift Up Your Hearts

In thinking about Mother Teresa of Calcutta, I have been re-reading my journal since August of 1976. On the flight from Bangkok, I sat next to a guy named Kevin who turned out to be a priest and teacher at Xavier College, a Jesuit school in Calcutta. He arranged for me to stay with the Brothers of Charity at Mother Teresa's Home for the Dying and the Destitute, where seven Brothers worked. I asked Brother Anthony, "Why are you so happy?" He answered right away: "I am an instrument of happiness for others." The Brothers help people live with a peaceful heart and die with dignity. St. Teresa of Calcutta taught them very well by her example.

One of Mother Teresa's sayings is, "DO SMALLL THINGS WITH GREAT LOVE."

Yes, these are words to live by, she was so close to Jesus. Through her dedication to the Poor, she teaches that WE ALL BELONG TO GOD. We are not better or worse, we are all God's children.

I asked Brother Anthony; do you have any advice for me? He spoke so simply in the Spirit of St. Teresa: "HAPPINESS IS KNOWING THAT GOD LOVES YOU AND THAT OTHERS LOVE YOU TOO. HAPPINESS IS NOT BASED ON WEALTH; IT IS BASED ON LOVE."

May we take some time daily to remember the Presence of God in our hearts and in our lives.

#### **TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

Labor Day originated in 1882 in New York City under the aegis of the Knights of Labor. Congress made it a legal holiday in 1894. Observing it this week gives us a good opportunity to reflect on the Catholic Church's social teachings for the last century or so. On May 15, 1891, Pope Leo XIII issued the encyclical *Rerum Novarum* on the condition of the working classes and labor. In doing so, he initiated a century in which Catholic teaching became more and more involved in the social issues of the day.

Unfortunately relegated to the shadows while the bright lights of controversy shine on other issues, Catholic social teaching remains largely unknown to many Catholics. It is the Catholic Church that championed such notions as a fair day's pay for a fair day's work, and continues to uphold the dignity of the human person against attacks from governments and corporations. Nearly every pope since Leo XIII has issued teachings on the subject. Take some time this Labor Day to familiarize yourself with some aspect of the Church's social teachings. In doing so, you will be taking responsibility as a member of the Body of Christ to commit yourself to the care of your neighbor.


