Weekend at Birney's



Quo Vadis Domine Family of Parishes

"In order to promote the centrality of the missionary presence of the Christian community in the world, it is important not only to think about a new experience of Parish, but also about the ministry and mission of priests, who, together with the lay faithful, have the task of being "salt

*and light of the world" (cf. Mt 5:13-14), a "lamp on a lamp-stand" (cf. Mk 4:21), showing forth the face of an evangelizing community, capable of an adequate reading of the signs of the times and of giving witness to coherent evangelical living."***

In my role as Moderator of our Quo Vadis Domine Family, I assumed the role of primary administrator of St. Alfred parish on July 1, in addition to St. Frances Cabrini, St. Mary Magdalen, and St. Constance parishes. Assisted by Fr. Ryan Walters, Fr. Johnson Pradeep, SAC and Fr. Grayson Heenan, together as a 'team of priests', we celebrate the sacramental, community, liturgical and spiritual needs of these four parishes.

"In such cases, the group of priests, in communion with the other members of the Parish community, act in common deliberation, the Moderator being the first among the other priests, all of whom are, to all intents and purposes, Parish Priests."

"The Moderator is responsible for coordinating the joint work of the Parish or Parishes entrusted to the group."

While our team of priests have four parishes in which to minister and shepherd, I pray that all of you will be patient with this new reality. By rotating between four parishes both on the weekends and during the week, this means we will be seen less, but working just as much, if not more, depending on the day or situation. Please know that we priests understand this is not an ideal way to 'pastor a parish', but we are living in unprecedented times. These 'unprecedented times' are the very reason Archbishop Vigneron reorganized all our parishes into groupings, called Families of Parishes.

The number of clergy and parishioners alike will continue to decline over the coming years. It is projected, based on age and trends, that by 2030 the Archdiocese of Detroit will have *at least* 55 less priests to serve in parishes. The more proactive we are in preparing for those days, the more effective we will be in achieving our mission of serving the people of God through Word, Service and Sacrament.

"As a further possibility, "where circumstances so require, the pastoral care of a parish, or of a number of parishes together, can be entrusted to several priests jointly". Such a solution can be adopted when, at the Bishop's discretion,

concrete circumstances require it so, particularly for the good of the communities concerned, through shared and more effective pastoral action, and to promote a spirituality of communion among priests."

Yours prayers of support and understanding are most welcome. Know that we will do our best to be as present as we are physically able between each of these four parishes.

As we move forward in the coming months, there will be more conversation about the many benefits of 'coming together' and the myriad of challenges as well. This will no doubt lead to some changes affecting aspects of each parish, especially our liturgical schedule, as we work together to organize ourselves in a logical, appropriate, and workable pastoral plan. While I cannot predict what this will mean for the future, what I can say with certainty, is that you will always have priests who minister to you, sacraments available to you and a parish to serve you. Where, what, and how that will look is for the future to unveil as we work together, focusing always on the mission of the Church.

Fin de Semana en Birney's

Familia parroquial Quo Vadis Domine

"Para promover la centralidad de la presencia misionera de la comunidad cristiana en el mundo, es importante pensar no solo en una nueva experiencia de parroquia, sino también en el ministerio y la misión de los sacerdotes, que, junto con los fieles laicos, tienen la tarea de ser "sal y luz del mundo" (cf. Mt 5, 13-14), una "lámpara sobre un candelabro" (cf. Mc 4, 21), que muestra el rostro de una comunidad evangelizadora, capaz de una lectura adecuada de los signos de los tiempos y de dar testimonio de una vida evangélica coherente".

En mi papel de Moderador de nuestra Familia Quo Vadis Domine, asumí el papel de administrador principal de la parroquia de San Alfredo el 1 de julio, además de las parroquias de Santa Francisca Cabrini, Santa María Magdalena y Santa Constanza. Asistidos por el Padre Ryan Walters, el Padre Johnson Pradeep, SAC y el Padre Grayson Heenan, juntos como un "equipo de sacerdotes", celebramos las necesidades sacramentales, comunitarias, litúrgicas y espirituales de estas cuatro parroquias.

"En ciertos casos, el grupo de sacerdotes, en comunión con los demás miembros de la comunidad parroquial, actúa en deliberación común, siendo el Moderador el primero entre los demás sacerdotes, todos los cuales son, a todos los efectos, párrocos".

"El Moderador es responsable de coordinar el trabajo conjunto de la Parroquia o Parroquias confiadas al grupo". Si bien nuestro equipo de sacerdotes tiene cuatro parroquias que administrar y pastorear, rezo para que todos ustedes sean pacientes con esta nueva realidad. Al rotar entre cuatro parroquias tanto los fines de semana como durante la semana, esto significa que se nos verá menos, pero trabajaremos tanto, si no más, dependiendo del día o la situación. Por favor, sepan que nosotros, los sacerdotes, entendemos que esta no es una forma ideal de 'pastorear una parroquia', pero estamos viviendo en tiempos sin precedentes. Estos "tiempos sin precedentes" son la razón por la que el arzobispo Vigneron reorganizó todas nuestras parroquias en agrupaciones, llamadas Familias de Parroquias.

El número de clérigos y feligreses por igual continuará disminuyendo en los próximos años. Se proyecta, con base en la edad y las tendencias, que para el año 2030 la Arquidiócesis de Detroit tendrá al menos 55 sacerdotes menos para servir en las parroquias. Cuanto más proactivos seamos en la preparación para esos días, más eficaces seremos para lograr nuestra misión de servir al pueblo de Dios a través de la Palabra, el Servicio y los Sacramentos.

"Por otra parte, "cuando las circunstancias lo requieran, el cuidado pastoral de una parroquia, o de varias parroquias juntas, puede ser confiado a varios sacerdotes conjuntamente". Esta solución puede adoptarse cuando, a criterio del

Obispo, las circunstancias concretas así lo requieran, en particular para el bien de las comunidades afectadas, mediante una acción pastoral compartida y más eficaz, y para promover una espiritualidad de comunión entre los sacerdotes". Sus oraciones de apoyo y comprensión son muy bienvenidas. Sepan que haremos todo lo posible para estar tan presentes como podamos físicamente entre cada una de estas cuatro parroquias.

A medida que avancemos en los próximos meses, habrá más conversaciones sobre los muchos beneficios de "unirse" y también sobre la gran cantidad de desafíos. Esto, sin duda, conducirá a algunos cambios que afectarán aspectos de cada parroquia, especialmente nuestro horario litúrgico, a medida que trabajamos juntos para organizarnos en un plan pastoral lógico, apropiado y viable. Si bien no puedo predecir lo que esto significará para el futuro, lo que puedo decir con certeza es que siempre tendrán sacerdotes que les ministren, sacramentos disponibles para ustedes y una parroquia que les sirva. Dónde, qué y cómo se verá eso es algo que se revelará en el futuro a medida que trabajemos juntos, centrándonos siempre en la misión de la Iglesia.

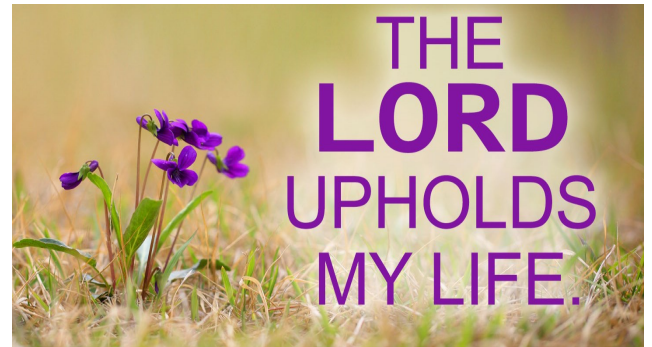


