Family of Parishes Listening Sessions

As we have now completed the Listening Sessions for our four parishes within the Quo Vadis Domine Family, I would like to offer a few 'take aways' for further reflection as we continue to discern

the best way forward in the coming year:

A summary of how we should receive the content of these presentations is like that of a 'doctors report'. After a visit to the doctor for a check-up or physical, we will hear the results from the tests that have been conducted. They are not personal, nor are they negative.....rather...they are designed to reflect a factual reporting of the status of our health. The doctor typically will then highlight the areas of concern and prescribe the need for 'change(s)' if we want to avoid worse news in the future. What we have shared is our version of a 'health report' for the parishes and why change is necessary.

What is primarily motivating the need to hold these meetings is the recognition that we are in a paradigm shift when it comes to parish life. A reminder of the sobering statistics regarding our aging parishioners, their level of support to the parish and the declining number of priests. In each of our parishes, the highest amount of contributors and the highest level of contributions come from the 66+ age group. Additionally, in the next eight years, our active priests' numbers in the AOD will decline by 50. In other words, our present model of parish life, is no longer sustainable....if we want to stay healthy.

Our Shepherds who lead our Church, locally in the Archdiocese of Detroit with Archbishop Vigneron and globally with Pope Francis, have both recognized the need for change in reading the 'signs of the times'. In 2020, the Holy Father promulgated an Instruction on the future of parish life in the Catholic Church entitled: **"The pastoral conversion of the Parish community in the service of the evangelizing mission of the Church"**, and in 2021, Archbishop Vigneron reorganized all parishes in the Archdiocese of Detroit into **Family of Parishes** to address these concerns and to properly plan for the future. Both can be found easily on-line.

The timeline that was shared at the Listening Sessions: October- present the information and conduct a dialogue with the parishioners. November- collate all the feedback and insights from the presentations/ conversations. December- pray/prepare for the changes that will become our future reality. January- announce the changes that will happen and when they will begin.

Reminder: the changes to be announced will not call for the closure of any of our parishes. I repeat...the changes to be announced will not call for the closure of any of our parishes. But there will be several changes to our liturgical schedules, offices, personnel, and operations.

What is not changing is your ability to practice your faith, receive the sacraments, worship in a community, conduct your meetings, groups, clubs, organizations, ministries and be served by a priest. It may look/feel a bit different and in some instances be in new locations....but all the above will still be very much present. Remember, we are in a paradigm shift. Change is rarely easy, but it is necessary and part of the human condition.

Throughout the coming months, more information will continue to be communicated so we are prepared for the coming changes. I ask for your prayers, charity, and support. Please be assured of mine and all the clergy of the Family who do our best to serve, love and honor you as priests of Jesus Christ.

Fin de Semana en Birney's

Sesiones de escucha de las familias de las parroquias

Ya que hemos completado las Sesiones de Escucha para nuestras cuatro parroquias dentro de la Familia Quo Vadis Domine, me gustaría ofrecer algunas "conclusiones" para una mayor reflexión mientras continuamos discerniendo el mejor camino a seguir en el próximo año:

Un resumen de cómo debemos recibir el contenido de estas presentaciones es como el de un "informe médico". Después de una visita al médico para un chequeo o examen físico, escucharemos los resultados de las pruebas que se han realizado. No son personales, ni son negativos... sino que están diseñados para reflejar un informe fáctico del estado de nuestra salud. Por lo general, el médico resaltaré las áreas de preocupación y prescribirá la necesidad de "cambios" si queremos evitar peores noticias en el futuro. Lo que hemos compartido es nuestra versión de un "informe de salud" para las parroquias y por qué es necesario un cambio.

Lo que motiva principalmente la necesidad de realizar estos encuentros es el reconocer de que estamos en un modelo de cambio en la vida parroquial. Un recordatorio de lo que las estadísticas muestran con respecto a nuestros feligreses envejecidos, su nivel de apoyo a la parroquia y la disminución del número de sacerdotes. En cada una de nuestras parroquias, la mayor cantidad de contribuyentes y el mayor nivel de contribuciones provienen del grupo de edad de 66+. Además, en los próximos ocho años, el número de sacerdotes activos en la AOD disminuirá en 50. En otras palabras, nuestro modelo actual de vida parroquial, ya no es sostenible... si queremos mantenernos sanos.

Nuestros pastores que dirigen nuestra Iglesia, localmente en la Arquidiócesis de Detroit con el Arzobispo Vigneron y globalmente con el Papa Francisco, han reconocido la necesidad de un cambio en la lectura de los 'signos de los tiempos'. En 2020, el Santo Padre promulgó una Instrucción sobre el futuro de la vida parroquial en la Iglesia Católica titulada: **"La conversión pastoral de la comunidad parroquial al servicio de la misión evangelizadora de la Iglesia"**, y en 2021, el Arzobispo Vigneron reorganizó todas las parroquias de la Arquidiócesis de Detroit en **Familias de Parroquias** para abordar estas preocupaciones y planificar adecuadamente el futuro. Ambos se pueden encontrar fácilmente en línea.

La línea de tiempo que se compartió en las Sesiones de Escucha: octubre- presentar la información y realizar un diálogo con los feligreses. noviembre: recopile todos los comentarios y puntos de vista de las presentaciones/conversaciones. diciembre- orar/prepararse para los cambios que se convertirán en nuestra realidad futura. enero: anuncie los cambios que sucederán y cuándo comenzarán.

Recordatorio: los cambios que se anunciarán no requerirán el cierre de ninguna de nuestras parroquias. Repito. Los

cambios que se anunciarán no requerirán el cierre de ninguna de nuestras parroquias. Pero habrá varios cambios en nuestros horarios litúrgicos, oficinas, personal y operaciones. Lo que no cambia es su capacidad de practicar su fe, recibir los sacramentos, adorar en una comunidad, llevar a cabo sus reuniones, grupos, organizaciones, ministerios y ser atendido por un sacerdote. Puede verse/sentirse un poco diferente y, en algunos casos, estar en nuevas ubicaciones ... pero todo lo anterior seguirá estando muy presente. Recordemos que estamos en un cambio de paradigma. El cambio rara vez es fácil, pero es necesario y forma parte de la condición humana.

A lo largo de los próximos meses, se seguirá comunicando más información para que estemos preparados para los cambios que se avecinan. Les pido sus oraciones, caridad y apoyo. Por favor, tengan la seguridad de la mía y de todo el clero de la Familia que hacemos todo lo posible para servirles, amarlos y honrarlos como sacerdotes de Jesucristo.

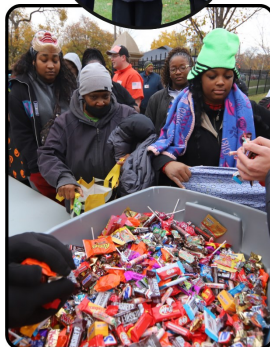

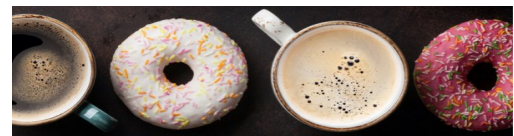
