Weekend at Birney's

National Vocations Awareness Week

National Vocation Awareness Week is an annual week-long celebration of the Catholic Church in the United States dedicated to promoting vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life through prayer and education, and to renew our prayers and support for those who are considering one of these particular vocations. Over the past nine years, our Quo Vadis Domine Family of Parishes has been blessed to have seminarians sent to our parishes for internships: Fr. Zaid Chabaan, Fr. Jeremy Schupach, Joseph Lennon and most recently Daniel Whalen. We are doubly blessed to have a candidate for the priesthood from St. Alfred parish: Lizandro Barba. He is presently in the School of Theology at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit and is scheduled to be ordained a Transitional Deacon in 2025. Ordination to the priesthood will occur in 2026.



A few reflections from Lizandro:

I grew up in a devout Mexican Catholic household where faith was very important. I was blessed with having very religious grandmothers. The first time I thought about becoming a priest was when I was about 8 years old. I was an altar server for many years and was involved with various Church events.

The Church became my second home. It wasn't until my senior year of high school that the thought of becoming a priest came back and it would persist until after my second year in college when I finally applied to the seminary.

While there are many aspects about the priesthood that I find rewarding, I would like to focus on a few. The Lord, while in prayer often says, "Love My people." He has made it clear how broken and wounded His people are and how they desperately need spiritual fathers who direct them to their heavenly Father. This spiritual paternity attracts me in knowing how God uses broken vessels like myself to bring souls to Him through the gift of the sacraments. The priest is the humble means through which Jesus' saving acts are made present in the world.

As Pope Saint John Paul II once said, "Be not afraid!" No one ever loses anything when he gives everything to Christ! A life without Christ is not worth living so therefore the question one must ask is, "How does God want me to live this life for Him?"

Discernment is about moving towards something incrementally and listening to what God wants you to do every step of the way.

Finally, but most importantly, is to continue a relationship with Jesus through various ways such as adoration, daily Mass, and/or spiritual readings, and of course your relationship with Our Lady, Mother of all priests.

Let us continue to pray for Lizandro, for all our former interns and for more from our Family of Parishes to follow in their footsteps. More information about Lizandro, all the seminarians for the Archdiocese of Detroit, and discernment

Listening Sessions: Preparing for the Future

In my article last week, I referred to an area of concern related to our aging clergy. This was one of the focal points of our Listening Session presentations that were conducted at every parish in our Quo Vadis Domine Family. ***The complete presentation can be found on our parish websites.*** From diocesan data, here is what priest numbers look like and their projections for the future. Next week, we'll take a closer look at the statistics about the parishioners of our Family.

Priests of the Archdiocese of Detroit:

- Average age is 64
- In 2024 we have 220 active priests
- In 2032 we will have 134 (that is a decrease of 86)
- Presently, we have 23 priests already over the age of 70 (retirement age for priests) still serving as a full-time pastor.
- Amongst our six Family parishes, we presently celebrate a total of 17 Masses each weekend. Six are Saturday Vigils and eleven on Sunday morning. Four of those eleven Sunday masses fall at the same hour of 10am.
- The norm for parish assignments for Pastors (Priest *In Solidum*) is 12 years, and for Associate Pastors (Priest *In Solidum*) is 3 years. Presently two of our Family priests are already at, or beyond, the 12-year mark (Fr. Dariusz -14 yrs. and Fr. Cornelius-12 yrs.) and Fr. Johnson is in the final year of his assignment. The archdiocese, because of the clergy shortage and the fact that we have 210 parishes in the AOD, has informed all priests that it should no longer be the expectation that every priest will be replaced if/when given a new assignment.

Fin de Semana en Birney's

Semana Nacional de Concientización Vocacional

La Semana Nacional de Concientización Vocacional es una celebración anual de una semana de la Iglesia Católica en los Estados Unidos dedicada a promover las vocaciones al sacerdocio, el diaconado y la vida consagrada a través de la oración y la educación, y para renovar nuestras oraciones y apoyo a aquellos que están considerando una de estas vocaciones en particular. Durante los últimos nueve años, nuestra Familia de Parroquias Quo Vadis Domine ha tenido la bendición de tener seminaristas enviados a nuestras parroquias para pasantías: el P. Zaid Chaaban, el P. Jeremy Schupach, Joseph Lennon y más recientemente Daniel Whalen. Nos sentimos doblemente bendecidos de tener un candidato al sacerdocio de la parroquia San Alfredo: Lizandro Barba. Actualmente se encuentra en la Escuela de Teología del Seminario Mayor del Sagrado Corazón en Detroit y está programado para ser ordenado Diácono de Transición en 2025. La ordenación sacerdotal tendrá lugar en 2026.



Algunas reflexiones de Lizandro:

Crecí en un hogar católico mexicano devoto donde la fe era muy importante. Tuve la bendición de tener abuelas muy religiosas. La primera vez que pensé en ser sacerdote fue cuando tenía unos 8 años. Fui monaguillo durante muchos años y participé en varios eventos de la Iglesia. La Iglesia se convirtió en mi segundo hogar. No fue hasta mi último año de escuela secundaria que la idea de convertirme en sacerdote regresó, y persistiría hasta después de mi segundo año en la universidad, cuando finalmente solicité el ingreso al seminario.

Si bien hay muchos aspectos del sacerdocio que me parecen gratificantes, me gustaría centrarme en algunos. El Señor, mientras está en oración, a menudo dice: "Ama a mi pueblo". Ha dejado claro cuán quebrantado y herido está su pueblo y cómo necesitan desesperadamente padres espirituales que los dirijan a su Padre celestial. Esta paternidad espiritual me atrae al saber cómo Dios usa vasos rotos como yo para traer almas a Él a través del don de los sacramentos. El sacerdote es el humilde medio a través del cual los actos salvíficos de Jesús se hacen presentes en el mundo.

Como dijo una vez el Papa San Juan Pablo II: "¡No tengáis miedo!" ¡Nadie pierde nada cuando le da todo a Cristo! Una vida sin Cristo no vale la pena vivirla, por lo tanto, la pregunta que uno debe hacerse es: "¿Cómo quiere Dios que viva esta vida para Él?"

El discernimiento se trata de avanzar hacia algo gradualmente y escuchar lo que Dios quiere que hagas en cada paso del camino.

Por último, pero lo más importante, es continuar una relación con Jesús a través de diversas formas como la adoración, la Misa diaria y/o las lecturas espirituales, y por supuesto su relación con Nuestra Señora, Madre de todos los sacerdotes.

Sigamos rezando por Lizandro, por todos nuestros ex pasantes y para que más de nuestra Familia de Parroquias sigan sus pasos. Sesiones de escucha: Preparándose para el futuro

En mi artículo de la semana pasada, me referí a un área de preocupación relacionada con nuestro clero envejecido. Este fue uno de los puntos focales de nuestras presentaciones de la Sesión de Escucha que se llevaron a cabo en cada parroquia de nuestra Familia Quo Vadis Domine. **La presentación completa se puede encontrar en los sitios web de nuestras parroquias.** A partir de los datos diocesanos, así es como se ve el número de sacerdotes y sus proyecciones para el futuro. La próxima semana, examinaremos más de cerca las estadísticas sobre los feligreses de nuestra Familia.

Sacerdotes de la Arquidiócesis de Detroit:

- La edad promedio es 64 años
- En 2024 tenemos 220 sacerdotes activos
- En 2032 tendremos 134 (es decir, una disminución de 86)
- Actualmente, tenemos 23 sacerdotes que ya tienen más de 70 años (*edad de jubilación para los sacerdotes*) que todavía sirven como pastores a tiempo completo.
- Entre nuestras seis parroquias familiares, actualmente celebramos un total de 17 Misas cada fin de semana. Seis son vigiliat los sábados y once los domingos por la mañana. Cuatro de esas once misas dominicales caen a la misma hora de las 10 de la mañana.
- La norma para las asignaciones parroquiales para los Pastores (Sacerdote *In Solidum*) es de 12 años, y para los Pastores Asociados (Sacerdote *In Solidum*) es de 3 años. Actualmente, dos de nuestros sacerdotes de la Familia ya están en la marca de los 12 años o más (el Padre Dariusz-14 años y el Padre Cornelius-12 años) y el Padre Johnson está en el último año de su asignación. La arquidiócesis, debido a la escasez de clero y al hecho de que tenemos 210 parroquias en la AOD, ha informado a todos los sacerdotes que ya no debe ser la expectativa de que cada sacerdote sea reemplazado si se le da una nueva asignación.

Today's Gospel story is about Jesus and the blind beggar, Bartimaeus. It is a very real story about Life in our own world. It's about the beautiful compassion of Jesus, His understanding and His healing. It's really about each one of us and our own need of Jesus' healing. We may all have some "blind spots" in our lives and hearts. It is easy to say (or think) That's stupid! "I'll do it my way, the right way."

Jesus knew the heart of Bartimaeus and what he wanted, but He wanted him to say it and really own it! YES!! He threw away his cloak (his old way of life). He sprang up and came to Jesus. Jesus said: "WHAT DO YOU WANT ME TO DO FOR YOU?" Next comes the straightforward and simple prayer of petition: a prayer from the heart, "MASTER, I WANT TO SEE".

We all have some examples in our own lives: I want peace, happiness and serenity. So many people have come to the programs here, Light Of Christ Prayer Group, Alcoholics Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous, and in the bigger picture of things we are all God's people asking the Lord heal me of my blindness. And Jesus said: "GO ON YOUR WAY, YOUR FAITH HAS SAVED YOU". And with His help, and our daily prayer we follow Him, ON THE WAY!

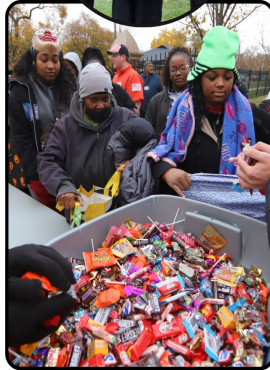

Treasures from our Tradition

“What is the Church if not the assembly of all the saints?” wrote the fifth-century bishop Niceta. Each Sunday, in the Profession of Faith, we express our belief in the communion of saints, the one body—with Christ as its head—made up of “those who are pilgrims on earth, the dead who are being purified and the blessed in heaven.” We are not alone!

The preface for All Saints begins, “For today by your gift we celebrate the festival of your city, the heavenly Jerusalem, our mother.” What astounding words! All Saints Day (like every solemnity) is nothing less than the festival of the fullness of the paschal mystery, our dying and rising in Christ. Of course, now in autumn the mystery comes “clothed” in glorious autumnal garb, and so we celebrate our Easter faith with signs of the harvest, signs of nature’s dying, signs of the “homecoming” that happens naturally when the weather gets cold and families find themselves together more often. While the dying can point to our own mortality, the homecoming reminds us of the mystery of our own resurrection with Christ.
