

Solemnity of Christ the King

"This Sunday is the last Sunday of the Church's liturgical year. On this Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. Each year we set aside this Sunday to reflect upon this title that we have given to Jesus. In Lectionary Cycle C, we read a portion of the passion from the Gospel of John, which is also part of the Gospel reading proclaimed each year on Good Friday.

In John's Gospel, Pilate is shown in a more favorable light than in the other Gospels. In today's reading, we hear one of two dialogues between Jesus and Pilate that are reported in John's Gospel. Pilate questions Jesus about the charges brought against him. Caiaphas and the high priests have charged Jesus with a political crime, one that would require a punishment of death. Pilate distances himself from the Jewish leaders who accuse Jesus; he is not a Jew, and he seems to want little to do with this Jewish affair.

In his responses to Pilate's questions, Jesus distinguishes his kingdom from the political powers of this world. King and kingdom may be appropriate terms for Jesus' mission and promise, but only by analogy. Jesus is king, but not the kind of king we imagine or expect. He was certainly not the kind of king Pilate feared he might be.

Jesus refers to a kingdom that does not belong to this world. This has been mentioned earlier in John's Gospel. Recall that in his prayer during the Last Supper discourse (see <u>John 17:6-18</u>), Jesus prayed for his disciples who are in the world but do not belong to the world. Yet like Jesus, they are sent into the world for the world's salvation. In today's reading, we see Jesus identify the final proof that his kingdom is not of this world: If his kingdom were of this world, then there would be people fighting to save him. Again we hear echoes of John's theme—salvation is worked out through a cosmic battle. It is helpful to return to the first chapter of John's Gospel to understand the context for Jesus' words to Pilate. Jesus came into the world, but the world did not know him. In John's language, the world prefers the darkness, and yet the light will not be overcome by the darkness.

Truth has been another important theme in John's Gospel. We see it emphasized in the conclusion of the dialogue between Jesus and Pilate. Those who know the truth will recognize Jesus as king and will know how to interpret this insight. Yet Jesus' kingship was hidden from many of his contemporaries. Only those chosen, those who have the eyes of faith, are able to see. As modern disciples of Jesus, we also struggle at times to recognize Jesus as king. Today's Gospel invites us to see with eyes of faith that we might recognize that Jesus, through his crucifixion and death, is indeed king and Savior of all." (loyolapress.com)

Fin de Semana en Birney's

Preparándose para el futuro

"La mera acción repetitiva que no tiene un impacto en la vida de las personas sigue siendo un intento estéril de supervivencia. Si la parroquia no exuda esa dinámica espiritual de evangelización, corre el riesgo de volverse autorreferencial y fosilizada, ofreciendo experiencias desprovistas de sabor evangélico y de impulso misionero y de interés solo para pequeños grupos". - Papa Francisco (Conversión de la vida parroquial para ser más evangélica)

Solemnidad de Cristo Rey

"Este domingo es el último domingo del año litúrgico de la Iglesia. En este domingo celebramos la solemnidad de Cristo Rey. Cada año apartamos este domingo para reflexionar sobre este título que le hemos dado a Jesús. En el Ciclo C del Leccionario, leemos una porción de la pasión del Evangelio de Juan, que también forma parte de la lectura del Evangelio proclamada cada año el Viernes Santo.

En el Evangelio de Juan, Pilato se muestra bajo una luz más favorable que en los otros Evangelios. En la lectura de hoy, escuchamos uno de los dos diálogos entre Jesús y Pilato que se relatan en el Evangelio de Juan. Pilato interroga a Jesús sobre los cargos que se le imputan. Caifás y los sumos sacerdotes han acusado a Jesús de un delito político, uno que requeriría un castigo de muerte. Pilato se distancia de los líderes judíos que acusan a Jesús; él no es judío, y parece querer tener poco que ver con este asunto judío.

En sus respuestas a las preguntas de Pilato, Jesús distingue su reino de los poderes políticos de este mundo. Rey y reino pueden ser términos apropiados para la misión y la promesa de Jesús, pero solo por analogía. Jesús es rey, pero no el tipo de rey que imaginamos o esperamos. Ciertamente no era el tipo de rey que Pilato temía que pudiera ser.

Jesús se refiere a un reino que no pertenece a este mundo. Esto ha sido mencionado anteriormente en el Evangelio de Juan. Recordemos que en su oración durante el discurso de la Última Cena (*ver Jn* 17:6-18), Jesús oró por sus discípulos que están en el mundo pero que no pertenecen al mundo. Sin embargo, al igual que Jesús, son enviados al mundo para la salvación del mundo. En la lectura de hoy, vemos a Jesús identificar la prueba final de que su reino no es de este mundo: si su reino fuera de este mundo entonces habría personas luchando para salvarlo. Una vez más, escuchamos ecos del tema de Juan: la salvación se lleva a cabo a través de una batalla cósmica. Es útil volver al primer capítulo del Evangelio de Juan para entender el contexto de las palabras de Jesús a Pilato. Jesús vino al mundo, pero el mundo no lo conoció. En el lenguaje de Juan, el mundo prefiere las tinieblas, y sin embargo, la luz no será vencida por las tinieblas.

La verdad ha sido otro tema importante en el Evangelio de Juan. Lo vemos enfatizado en la conclusión del diálogo entre Jesús y Pilato. Aquellos que conocen la verdad reconocerán a Jesús como rey y sabrán cómo interpretar esta percepción. Sin embargo, el reinado de Jesús se ocultó a muchos de sus contemporáneos. Solo los elegidos, los que tienen los ojos de la fe, son capaces de ver. Como discípulos modernos de Jesús, a veces también luchamos por reconocer a Jesús como rey. El Evangelio de hoy nos invita a ver con ojos de fe para que podamos reconocer que Jesús, a través de su crucifixión y muerte, es realmente rey y Salvador de todos". (loyolapress.com)



In 1830 the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to 24-yearold Catherine Labouré in Paris, France. She commissioned Catherine to have copies of what came to be known as the "Miraculous Medal" produced and distributed for the benefit of the faithful. The medal includes the prayer, "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee."
