Preparing for the Future: How to positively prepare for change

1. **Acknowledge that things are changing:** Sometimes we get so caught up in fighting change that we put off dealing with it. Denial is a powerful force, and it protects us in many ways. However, stepping outside of it and saying to yourself, "Things are changing, and it is okay" can be less stressful than putting it off. Much changed for Christ in His three years of public ministry, but He never allowed the stress of change to negatively affect the mission.

2. **Write down the positives that come from change:** Maybe due to a change in your life you have met new people, new parishioners? Maybe you started practicing healthier habits? Maybe you became more spiritually active? Maybe you became more confident in your faith? Maybe the change helped you prioritize what is most important in your life. Change presents us with the opportunity to grow, and it's important to acknowledge how things can become better as a result...especially if we see with the eyes of faith. Pray about the change and ask Christ to help you see the positive.

3. **Be proactive, not reactive:** Being proactive means accepting change and working preventatively. This means you figure out what steps you need to take before something happens. Being reactive means you wait until something has happened and then you act. It could mean becoming active with parish groups or ministries that help you realize that you can make a positive impact in the parish and in society. Allow the Holy Spirit to enliven your efforts towards the positives that come from change.

4. **Back away from social media:** When you go through change, you may gravitate toward social media—maybe posting what is going on in your life. First, make sure you are in a calm state when you post—and keep in mind that whatever you post never really disappears. Also, if you are comparing your life to your friends' lives on social media, remember that most people post only the "highlight reel" of their lives, not the stressful moments. Everyone has challenges or obstacles; it's just different obstacles with different people. Prayer is always the better option when finding ways to manage/share stress.

5. **Find joy in life:** And finally, give yourself a break. In a time of change, you may feel a little out of control. Make a point to incorporate more laughter and fun into your life. Laughing increases dopamine, serotonin, and endorphins—and that makes you feel good. Laughing also decreases cortisol—a stress-producing hormone. We are meant to be a people of joy and peace...because our Lord is alive, has defeated death and thus given a reason to always hope, no matter the circumstance.

First Sunday of Advent Reflection

"Today is the first Sunday of Advent, which is also the first Sunday of the new liturgical year. The Advent season includes the four Sundays that precede Christmas. Advent is a time of preparation for the coming of the Lord. **In this season, we recall two central elements of our faith: the final coming of the Lord in glory and the incarnation of the Lord in the birth of Jesus.** The key themes of the Advent season are watchful waiting, preparation, and justice.

In this new liturgical year, the Gospel of Luke will be the primary Gospel proclaimed. Today's Gospel is taken from the last chapter before the passion narrative in which Jesus is teaching in the Temple. We hear Jesus speak to His disciples about the need for vigilance and prayer as they wait for the coming of the Son of Man in glory. This passage marks the conclusion of a lengthy dialogue in which Jesus predicts the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem, warns about the persecution and tribulations to follow, and identifies the signs that will signal the coming of the Son of Man in glory.

The community for whom Luke wrote his Gospel may have believed that they were already experiencing some of the events Jesus described. Most scholars believe that Luke's Gospel was written after the destruction of Jerusalem by the Romans in 70 A.D. At the time, many Christians interpreted this event as an indication that Jesus' second coming was near.

Though Jesus predicts a time of destruction and fear, Jesus indicates that others will be frightened; Jesus' disciples are not to fear but are to stand tall. Yet Jesus does not promise deliverance from anxiety or tribulations. He encourages His disciples to pray for strength. The early Christian communities did not find consolation in the promise of a utopia, nor should we. **Instead, we find in our Christian faith how we witness to God's unfailing love for us in all circumstances.** (*loyolapress.com*)

Fin de Semana en Birney's

Prepararse para el futuro: Cómo prepararse positivamente para el cambio

1. **Reconocer que las cosas están cambiando:** A veces nos quedamos tan atrapados en la lucha contra el cambio que posponemos lidiar con él. La negación es una fuerza poderosa y nos protege de muchas maneras. Sin embargo, salir de ella y decirte a ti mismo: "Las cosas están cambiando y está bien" puede ser menos estresante que posponerlo. Mucho cambió para Cristo en sus tres años de ministerio público, pero nunca permitió que el estrés del cambio afectara negativamente la misión.

2. **Anota los aspectos positivos que se derivan del cambio:** ¿Quizás debido a un cambio en tu vida has conocido a nuevas personas, nuevos feligreses? ¿Quizás empezaste a practicar hábitos más saludables? ¿Quizás te volviste más activo espiritualmente? ¿Quizás te volviste más seguro de tu fe? Tal vez el cambio te ayudó a priorizar lo que es más importante en tu vida. El cambio nos presenta la oportunidad de crecer, y es importante reconocer cómo las cosas pueden mejorar como resultado... especialmente si vemos con los ojos de la fe. Ore por el cambio y pídale a Cristo que le ayude a ver lo positivo.

3. **Sé proactivo, no reactivo:** Ser proactivo significa aceptar el cambio y trabajar de forma preventiva. Esto significa que averiguas qué pasos debes seguir antes de que algo suceda. Ser reactivo significa que esperas hasta que algo haya sucedido y luego actúas. Podría significar participar activamente en grupos parroquiales o ministerios que te ayuden a darte cuenta de que puedes tener un impacto positivo en la parroquia y en la sociedad. Permite que el Espíritu Santo anime tus esfuerzos hacia los aspectos positivos que provienen del cambio.

4. **Aléjate de las redes sociales:** Cuando atraviesas un cambio, es posible que gravites hacia las redes sociales, tal vez publicando lo que está sucediendo en tu vida. Primero, asegúrate de estar en un estado de calma cuando publiques, y ten en cuenta que lo que sea que publiques nunca desaparece realmente. Además, si estás comparando su vida con la vida de tus amigos en las redes sociales, recuerda que la mayoría de las personas publican solo el "carrete destacado" de sus vidas, no los momentos estresantes. Todo el mundo tiene retos u obstáculos; son solo diferentes obstáculos con diferentes personas. La oración es siempre la mejor opción cuando se encuentran formas de manejar / compartir el estrés.

5. **Encuentra la alegría en la vida:** Y por último, date un respiro. En una época de cambio, es posible que te sientas un poco fuera de control. Esfuérzate por incorporar más risas y diversión a tu vida. La risa aumenta la dopamina, la serotonina y las endorfinas, y eso te hace sentir bien. La risa también disminuye el cortisol, una hormona productora de estrés. Estamos destinados a ser un pueblo de alegría y paz... porque nuestro Señor está vivo, ha vencido a la muerte y, por lo tanto, ha dado una razón para esperar siempre, sin importar las circunstancias.

Reflexión del Primer Domingo de Adviento

"Hoy es el primer domingo de Adviento, que es también el primer domingo del nuevo año litúrgico. El tiempo de Adviento incluye los cuatro domingos que preceden a la Na-

vidad. El Adviento es un tiempo de preparación para la venida del Señor. **En este tiempo, recordamos dos elementos centrales de nuestra fe: la venida final del Señor en gloria y la encarnación del Señor en el nacimiento de Jesús.** Los temas clave de la temporada de Adviento son la espera vigilante, la preparación y la justicia.

En este nuevo año litúrgico, el Evangelio de Lucas será el primer Evangelio proclamado. El Evangelio de hoy está tomado del último capítulo antes de la narración de la pasión en la que Jesús está enseñando en el Templo. Escuchamos a Jesús hablar a sus discípulos sobre la necesidad de vigilancia y oración mientras esperan la venida del Hijo del Hombre en gloria. Este pasaje marca la conclusión de un largo diálogo en el que Jesús predice la destrucción del Templo de Jerusalén, advierte sobre la persecución y las tribulaciones que vendrán, e identifica las señales que señalarán la venida del Hijo del Hombre en gloria.

La comunidad para la que Lucas escribió su Evangelio puede haber creído que ya estaban experimentando algunos de los eventos descritos por Jesús. La mayoría de los eruditos creen que el Evangelio de Lucas fue escrito después de la destrucción de Jerusalén por los romanos en el año 70 d.C. En ese momento, muchos cristianos interpretaron este evento como una indicación de que la segunda venida de Jesús estaba cerca.

Aunque Jesús predice un tiempo de destrucción y temor, Jesús indica que otros se asustarán; Los discípulos de Jesús no deben temer, sino que deben mantenerse erguidos. Sin embargo, Jesús no promete la liberación de la ansiedad o las tribulaciones. Anima a sus discípulos a orar para obtener fuerzas. Las primeras comunidades cristianas no encontraron consuelo en la promesa de una utopía, ni nosotros deberíamos encontrarlo. **En cambio, encontramos en nuestra fe cristiana cómo damos testimonio del amor inagotable de Dios por nosotros en todas las circunstancias.** (loyolapress.com)

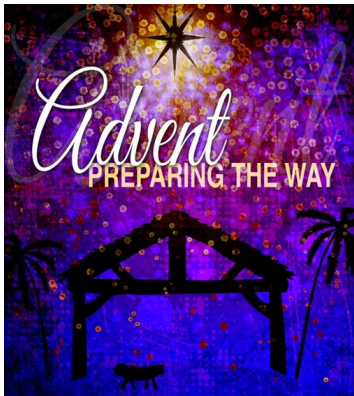

First Sunday of Advent TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Occasionally, someone raises a surprised complaint that while Christmas arrives on Santa's sleigh at the Macy's parade on Thanksgiving Day, the Church doesn't catch on too fast. They may even say that Advent is a new-fangled idea. Not so. To trace its beginnings, we have to go back to the fourth or fifth century in France (then Gaul), when Epiphany was the favored day, next to Easter, for baptism. The old pagan structures of Rome were collapsing then, and many people sought to be baptized. Since adults always prepared for baptism by fasting, folks counted back a few weeks for a kind of retreat. Before too long, bishops were advising everyone to attend church frequently beginning on December 17. Soon, artists were imagining ways of expressing the Advent mystery, and in Italy this gave rise to beautiful mosaics of empty thrones awaiting the arrival of the Lord of all creation.

Advent as we know it develops on two separate tracks: the first having to do with our spiritual preparation for celebrating the Christmas feast, and the second having to do with the way this is organized and expressed in the liturgical readings and prayers every day of the season.
