Preparing for the future

As we look forward to the changes that will occur for our Quo Vadis Domine Family in the coming year, I thought it would be helpful to review the following: At Synod 16, the 2016 Archdiocesan-wide gathering of lay people, clergy and Archbishop Vigneron, many frank discussions were held in which the participants discerned and evaluated together the present state of the Archdiocese of Detroit. The discussions brought to light what might be called the "capital vices" of our local Church—those bad habits that affect our witness to Christ. A look at these bad habits will help us identify both what has to change and what we are called to become. Next week we'll explore the 'good habits'.

Our bad habits are those attitudes, misunderstandings, or deceptions that hold us back from unleashing the Gospel. Five of these stood out in particular at the Synod.

A worldly notion of the Church: Too often the Church is viewed, even by Catholics, as simply a human institution, and the Catholic faith as merely a lifestyle enhancer. In this outlook the Church's value is based primarily on its contributions to society, whether in education, health care, advocacy, or service to the poor. The priest is seen as a kind of ecclesiastical civil servant. When this outlook prevails the Church's mission can become captive to human plans, and the clarity of our witness to the Gospel is compromised. Cardinal John Henry Newman observed that perhaps one of the reasons Christ's disciples in a particular time and place seem to escape being persecuted is that they have conformed themselves to the thinking and behavior of their society. They "have taken the world's pay, and must not grudge its yoke." What is lacking in such a worldly mindset is a humble recognition that the Church belongs to Christ as his body, his beloved bride. It is Christ who directs the mission and activity of the Church and who will bring her without fail to her final destiny. All of us, clergy and laity alike, are servants of the Lord who will one day render an account of our service to him.

- Spiritual lethargy: The second vice is closely related to the first. If the Church is viewed as a human institution, then it is easy to become overwhelmed by the challenges that face us. The feeling that we have to carry the burden of a struggling Church contributes in turn to weariness, discontent, and defeatism. It may seem as if we are pushing a rock up a steep hill and getting nowhere. Where there has been such lethargy, dear brothers and sisters, let us repent! It is a little like a marriage that has become stale: it is time to "return to our first love" (cf. Rev 2:4), to go through a "marriage encounter" between ourselves and Jesus—or perhaps to fall in love with him for the first time. If our ardor has cooled, let us ask the Lord to touch us once again with a burning ember from his altar (cf. Isa 6:6) that we may be rekindled in our zeal for him.
- Status quo mentality: There can be a kind of institutional hardening, a resistance to change. We may consider that certain institutional forms, customs, and practices have carried us in the past and we do not want to put in the effort to reform them. Pope Francis speaks of "the complacent attitude that says: 'We have always done it this way.'" Instead he urges all local Churches to "be bold and creative in this task of rethinking the goals, structures, style and methods of evangelization in their respective communities." [13]
- <u>Fear:</u> The fourth bad habit can sometimes be more hidden. We can be subtly influenced by a combination of fears: fear of taking risks, fear of failure, fear of losing control, fear of going beyond our comfort zone. But yielding to fear keeps us in spiritual bondage (cf. <u>Heb 2:15</u>). How often Scripture tells us, "Fear not!" How often the Lord assures the fearful of his steadfast love and his help (cf. <u>Isa 43:1-2</u>). We must choose not to be guided by fear. Whenever we become aware of fears and anxieties influencing us, we can bring them before the Lord in all honesty and ask him to replace them with apostolic courage.
- <u>A complaining attitude:</u> A common temptation in reaction to problems is to lament that we no longer have the power or prestige we once had. We don't have as many priests, as many resources, as much money, as much support. Like the Israelites in the desert, we can take on an attitude of "murmuring," finding fault with God and others. But complaining leads only to discouragement and paralysis. God thinks we have enough, because we have him. "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me" (<u>Phil 4:13</u>). Preparándose para el futuro

Mientras esperamos los cambios que ocurrirán para nuestra Familia Quo Vadis Domine en el próximo año, pensé que sería útil revisar lo siguiente: En el Sínodo 16, la reunión arquidiocesana de 2016 de laicos, clérigos y el arzobispo Vigneron, se llevaron a cabo muchas discusiones francas en las que los participantes discernieron y evaluaron juntos el estado actual de la Arquidiócesis de Detroit. Las discusiones sacaron a la luz lo que podría llamarse los "vicios capitales" de nuestra Iglesia local: esos malos hábitos que afectan nuestro testimonio de Cristo. Una mirada a estos malos hábitos nos ayudará a identificar tanto lo que tiene que cambiar como lo que estamos llamados a llegar a ser. La semana que viene exploraremos los 'buenos hábitos'.

Nuestros malos hábitos son aquellas actitudes, malentendidos o engaños que nos impiden dar rienda suelta al Evangelio. Cinco de ellos se destacaron en particular en el Sínodo.

Una noción mundana de la Iglesia: Con demasiada frecuencia la Iglesia es vista, incluso por los católicos, como una simple institución humana, y la fe católica como un mero potenciador del estilo de vida. Desde este punto de vista, el valor de la Iglesia se basa principalmente en sus contribuciones a la sociedad, ya sea en la educación, la atención médica, la defensa o el servicio a los pobres. El sacerdote es visto como una especie de funcionario eclesiástico. Cuando prevalece esta perspectiva, la misión de la Iglesia puede quedar cautiva de los proyectos humanos, y la claridad de nuestro testimonio del Evangelio se ve comprometida. El cardenal John Henry Newman observó que tal vez una de las razones por las que los discípulos de Cristo en un tiempo y lugar particulares parecen escapar de ser perseguidos es que se han conformado al pensamiento y al comportamiento de su sociedad. "Han tomado la paga del mundo, y no deben renegar de su yugo". [12] Lo que falta en una mentalidad tan mundana es un humilde reconocimiento de que la Iglesia pertenece a Cristo como su cuerpo, su esposa amada. Es Cristo quien dirige la misión y la actividad de la Iglesia y quien la llevará indefectiblemente a su destino final. Todos nosotros, clérigos y laicos por igual, somos siervos del Señor que un día rendirán cuenta de nuestro servicio a Él.

- Letargo espiritual: El segundo vicio está estrechamente relacionado con el primero. Si la Iglesia es vista como una institución humana, entonces es fácil sentirse abrumado por los desafíos que enfrentamos. El sentimiento de que tenemos que llevar el peso de una Iglesia en lucha contribuye a su vez al cansancio, al descontento y al derrotismo. Puede parecer como si estuviéramos empujando una roca por una colina empinada y no llegamos a ninguna parte. Donde ha habido tal letargo, queridos hermanos y hermanas, jarrepintámonos! Es un poco como un matrimonio que se ha vuelto rancio: es hora de «volver a nuestro primer amor» (cf. Ap 2,4), de pasar por un «encuentro matrimonial» entre nosotros y Jesús, o tal vez de enamorarnos de Él por primera vez. Si nuestro ardor se ha enfriado, pidamos al Señor que nos toque una vez más con una brasa ardiente de su altar (cf. <u>Is 6, 6</u>) para que podamos reavivar nuestro celo por él.
- Mentalidad de statu quo: Puede haber una especie de endurecimiento institucional, una resistencia al cambio. Podemos considerar que ciertas formas, costumbres y prácticas institucionales nos han llevado en el pasado y no queremos hacer el esfuerzo de reformarlas. El Papa Francisco habla de "la actitud complaciente que dice: 'Siempre lo hemos hecho así". En cambio, insta a todas las Iglesias locales a "ser audaces y creativas en esta tarea de repensar los objetivos, las estructuras, el estilo y los métodos de evangelización en sus respectivas comunidades".
- Miedo: El cuarto mal hábito a veces puede estar más oculto. Podemos ser sutilmente influenciados por una combinación de miedos: miedo a tomar riesgos, miedo al fracaso, miedo a perder el control, miedo a salir de nuestra zona de confort. Pero ceder al miedo nos mantiene en esclavitud espiritual (cf. Hb 2:15). ¡Cuántas veces la Escritura nos dice: "¡No temáis!" ¡Cuántas veces el Señor asegura a los temerosos de su misericordia y de su ayuda (cf. Is 43, 1-2)! Debemos elegir no dejarnos guiar por el miedo. Cada vez que nos damos cuenta de los temores y ansiedades que nos influyen, podemos llevarlos ante el Señor con toda honestidad y pedirle que los reemplace con valentía apostólica.
- <u>Una actitud quejumbrosa:</u> Una tentación común en reacción a los problemas es lamentarse de que ya no tenemos el poder o el prestigio que alguna vez tuvimos. No tenemos tantos sacerdotes, ni tantos recursos, ni tanto dinero, ni tanto apoyo. Al igual que los israelitas en el desierto, podemos adoptar una actitud de "murmuración", de criticar a Dios y a los demás. Pero quejarse sólo conduce al desaliento y a la parálisis. Dios piensa que tenemos suficiente, porque lo tenemos a él. "Todo lo puedo en Cristo que me fortalece" (<u>Flp 4,13</u>). Dar rienda suelta al Evangelio: unleashthegospel.org

Second Sunday of Advent TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Look around most Catholic churches, and you will discover an image of John the Baptist, often in the old baptistery, or in a window near where the font is or was located. He has two feast days in the calendar: one commemorating his birth, and the other his death. There are only three nativities in our calendar: for Jesus, for Mary, and for the Baptist. John's birthday is reckoned according to the schedule given in Luke's Gospel of the angel's announcement to Mary. The angel tells her that her cousin Elizabeth is in the sixth month of pregnancy, and so Mary hastens to help her. Reckoning Christmas as December 25, we count backwards nine months to March 25 for the Feast of the Annunciation. Then we count forward three months to June 24 for John the Baptist's birth. Halfway to Christmas, his nativity gives ample reason for rejoicing in the summer, and his symbols of fire and water are used playfully in bonfires and dives into the sea. Even at the polar opposite of Christmas in the calendar, the energy of Christ's birth in the Incarnation provides cause for rejoicing.


