Weekend at Birney's



Fourth Sunday of Advent Reflection

"On this the last Sunday before Christmas, our Gospel reading prepares us to witness Christ's birth by showing us

how Jesus was recognized as Israel's longawaited Messiah even before his birth. The Gospel turns our attention from the ministry of John the Baptist to the events that preceded John the Baptist's birth. The story of John the Baptist and his parents, Elizabeth and Zechariah, are reported only in Luke's Gospel. Luke pairs the birth of John the Baptist and Jesus, establishing John's early connection to the Messiah.

Our Gospel reading recalls Mary's actions after the announcement of Jesus' birth by the angel Gabriel. Mary goes to visit Elizabeth, her cousin, who is also with child. Elizabeth greets Mary with full recognition of the roles that they and their unborn children will play in God's plan for salvation. If we were to continue to read the verses that follow in Luke's Gospel, we would hear Mary respond to Elizabeth's greeting with her song of praise, the Magnificat. Both women recall and echo God's history of showing favor upon the people of Israel.

In Luke's Gospel the Holy Spirit helps reveal Jesus' identity as God to those who believe. Elizabeth is filled with the Holy Spirit and sings Mary's praise because she bears the Lord. We sing these words of praise to Mary in the Hail Mary. Even John the Baptist, the unborn child in Elizabeth's womb, is said to recognize the presence of the Lord and leaps for joy.

It is appropriate in this season of Advent that we consider the role of Mary in God's plan of salvation. Elizabeth describes Mary as the first disciple, as the one who believed that God's word to her would be fulfilled. Mary's faith enabled her to recognize the work of God in her people's history and in her own life. Her openness to God allowed God to work through her so that salvation might come to everyone. Because of this, Mary is a model and symbol of the Church. May we be like Mary, open and cooperative in God's plan for salvation." (loyolapress.com)

Fin de Semana en Birney's

Reflexión del Cuarto Domingo de Adviento

"En este último domingo antes de Navidad, nuestra lectura del Evangelio nos prepara para presenciar el nacimiento de Cristo mostrándonos cómo Jesús fue reconocido como el Mesías tan esperado de Israel incluso antes de su nacimiento. El Evangelio desvía nuestra atención del ministerio de Juan el Bautista a los acontecimientos que precedieron al nacimiento de Juan el Bautista. La historia de Juan el Bautista y sus padres, Isabel y Zacarías, solo se menciona en el Evangelio de Lucas. Lucas une el nacimiento de Juan el Bautista y Jesús, estableciendo la conexión temprana de Juan con el Mesías.

Nuestra lectura del Evangelio recuerda las acciones de María después del anuncio del nacimiento de Jesús por el ángel Gabriel. María va a visitar a Isabel, su prima, que también está encinta. Isabel saluda a María con pleno reconocimiento del papel que ellos y sus hijos no nacidos desempeñarán en el plan de Dios para la salvación. Si continuáramos leyendo los versículos que siguen en el Evangelio de Lucas, escucharíamos a María responder al saludo de Isabel con su canto de alabanza, el Magnificat. Ambas mujeres recuerdan y se hacen eco de la historia de Dios de mostrar favor sobre el pueblo de Israel.

En el Evangelio de Lucas, el Espíritu Santo ayuda a revelar la identidad de Jesús como Dios a los que creen. Isabel está llena del Espíritu Santo y canta las alabanzas de María porque lleva al Señor. Cantamos estas palabras de alabanza a María en el Ave María. Se dice que incluso Juan el Bautista, el niño no nacido en el vientre de Isabel, reconoce la presencia del Señor y salta de alegría.

Es apropiado que en este tiempo de Adviento consideremos el papel de María en el plan de salvación de Dios. Elizabeth describe a María como la primera discípula, como la que creyó que la palabra de Dios para ella se cumpliría. La fe de María le permitió reconocer la obra de Dios en la historia de su pueblo y en su propia vida. Su apertura a Dios permitió que Dios obrara a través de ella para que la salvación pudiera llegar a todos. Por eso, María es modelo y símbolo de la Iglesia. Que seamos como María, abiertos y cooperativos en el plan de salvación de Dios". (loyolapress.com)



Fourth Sunday of Advent TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In ancient pagan Rome, these days in mid-December were a time for general slacking off at work and far too much rejoicing. The period of leisure after the harvest and a whole cluster of pagan festivals were a force for the church to reckon with.

The Saturnalia, breaking out on December 17, was a time of high living and loose morals. Christians were advised by their bishops to drop out of the mayhem and do some serious fasting. A famous church council at Saragossa in Spain made a season of fasting mandatory from December 17 to December 23, exactly coinciding with the Saturnalia. The bishops at that time were perhaps less concerned with preparing for Christmas than with resisting the kind of loose living going on.

Modern times have restored a bit of the Saturnalia spirit to our culture, so that a general period of partying with a vague connection to religion is now upon us. How does a Christian keep balance? The practice of charity by remembering the poor in our gift giving, of hospitality in finding a place at our holiday tables for the poor and lonely, and of daily prayer in the home and at church are great helps.

Although Advent is not a penitential season like Lent, it is a time for making room in our lives for what matters most.

Let's crown our Christmas season with cake and chalk

The Christmas season comes to a close with Epiphany/Feast of the Three Kings, which honors the arrival of the Magi to the manger of the Christ Child and the manifestation of Jesus to the world as the Son of God.

Join us in the Narthex after all Masses January 4/5 for fellowship and a slice of King Cake, a special pastry enjoyed by cultures around the world on Epiphany.

In addition, pick up chalk as we honor a centuriesold tradition of blessing our homes and everyone who enters it during the coming year. When parishes were smaller, priests would visit and bless the homes of each parishioner. As parishes grew, household members took on the responsibility.

We encourage you to take the chalk home and write on the door frame the first two digits of the year + C + M + B + the last two digits of the new year: 20 + C + M + B + 25.

The C M B serves two meanings:

- The initials of the Wise Men (Casper, Melchior and Balthasar).
- \cdot The first letters of the Latin phrase: Christus mansionem benedicat (May Christ bless the house).

Then, recite a simple prayer like this, or the Epiphany prayer of your choosing:

"Loving God, we ask you to bless our household and all who enter. May all be blessed with health, goodness of heart, gentleness, and the desire to do your will. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen."
