2025: Jubilee Year 'Pilgrims of Hope'

In the Roman Catholic tradition, a Holy Year, or Jubilee is a great religious event. It is a year of forgiveness of sins and the punishment due to sin. It is a year of reconciliation between adversaries, of

conversion and receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and consequently of solidarity, hope, justice, commitment to serve God with joy and in peace with our brothers and sisters. A Jubilee year is above all the year of Christ, who brings life and grace to humanity.

A Jubilee can be "ordinary" if it falls after the set period of years, and "extraordinary" when it is proclaimed for some outstanding event. The first was in 1300 and there have been twenty-eight "ordinary" Holy Years since then. The custom of calling "extraordinary" Jubilees began in the 16th century, and they can vary in length from a few days to a year. There have been two extraordinary jubilees in this century: 1933 proclaimed by Pope Pius XI to mark the 1900th anniversary of Redemption and in 1983 proclaimed by Pope John Paul II to mark 1,950 years since the Redemption carried out by Christ through his Death and Resurrection in the year 33. Over the centuries, the time between jubilees has fluctuated between, 100, 50, 33 and 25 years. In 2000, St. John Paul II declared ordinary jubilees to take place every 25 years.

The origin of the Christian Jubilee goes back to Bible times. The Law of Moses prescribed a special year for the Jewish people: "You shall hallow the fiftieth year and proclaim the liberty throughout the land, to all its inhabitants; it shall be a jubilee for you when each of you shall return to his property and each of you shall return to his family."(Leviticus 25:10)

The Jubilee is called a Holy Year, not only because it begins, is marked, and ends with solemn holy acts, but also because its purpose is to encourage holiness of life. It was convoked to strengthen faith, encourage works of charity and brotherly communion within the Church and in society and to call Christians to be more sincere and coherent in their faith in Christ, the only Savior.

Return to Ordinary Time

"This Sunday we begin the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. For many Sundays in this cycle, our readings will be taken from the Gospel of Luke. Occasionally, however, we will read from John's Gospel. This is true of today's Gospel reading, which describes the beginning of Jesus' ministry and his first miracle.

To situate today's reading within the context of John's Gospel, we note that John's report of this event follows Jesus' call of his first disciples. John tells us that Jesus

and his disciples were invited to this wedding at Cana, as was Jesus' mother, Mary.

In the Church's liturgical history, the wedding feast of Cana is closely associated with the baptism of the Lord and the adoration of the infant Jesus by the Wise Men. In this context, the sign Jesus performs at the wedding feast is celebrated as an epiphany or a manifestation of Jesus' divinity.

Marriage and wedding feasts are metaphors used in Scripture to describe God's salvation and the Kingdom of God. Here at the beginning of Jesus' public ministry, John's Gospel seeks to establish that Jesus is going to re-interpret and fulfill Yahweh's promise to Israel. Jesus establishes the New Covenant. A hint about what this New Covenant will be like is made evident in the deed that Jesus performs. Asked to do something to address the awkward situation that the absence of wine at a wedding feast would create, Jesus' miracle produces vast quantities of wine—six jars holding thirty gallons each are filled to overflowing with choice wine.

This lavish response to a simple human need is a vision for us of the abundance of God's kingdom. It challenges us to respond generously when confronted with human need today. We respond as best we can, fully confident that God can transform our efforts, bringing the Kingdom of God to fulfillment among us." (loyolapress.com)

Fin de Semana en Birney's

2025: Año Jubilar "Peregrinos de Esperanza"

En la tradición católica romana, un Año Santo o Jubileo es un gran evento religioso. Es un año de perdón de pecados y del castigo debido al pecado. Es un año de reconciliación entre adversarios, de conversión y de recibir el Sacramento de la Reconciliación, y en consecuencia de solidaridad, de esperanza, de justicia, de compromiso para servir a Dios con alegría y en paz con nuestros hermanos y hermanas. Un año jubilar es sobre todo el año de Cristo, que trae vida y gracia a la humanidad.

Un Jubileo puede ser "ordinario" si cae después del período establecido de años, y "extraordinario" cuando es proclamado por algún evento destacado. La primera fue en 1300 y desde entonces ha habido veintiocho Años Santos "ordinarios". La costumbre de convocar Jubileos "extraordinarios" comenzó en el siglo XVI, y pueden variar en duración desde unos pocos días hasta un año. Ha habido dos jubileos extraordinarios en este siglo: 1933 proclamado por el Papa Pío XI para conmemorar el 1900 aniversario de la Redención y en 1983 proclamado por el Papa Juan Pablo II para conmemorar los 1.950 años de la Redención llevada a cabo por Cristo a través de su Muerte y Resurrección en el año 33. A lo largo de los siglos, el tiempo entre jubileos ha fluctuado entre 100, 50, 33 y 25 años. En el año 2000, San Juan Pablo II declaró que los jubileos ordinarios debían celebrarse cada 25 años.

El origen del Jubileo cristiano se remonta a los tiempos bíblicos. La Ley de Moisés prescribía un año especial para el pueblo judío: "Santificarás el año cincuenta y proclamarás la libertad en toda la tierra, a todos sus habitantes; Será un jubileo para vosotros cuando cada uno de vosotros vuelva a su hacienda y cada uno de vosotros vuelva a su familia". (Levítico 25:10.)

El Jubileo se llama Año Santo, no sólo porque comienza, se marca y termina con solemnes actos santos, sino también porque su finalidad es fomentar la santidad de vida. Fue convocada para fortalecer la fe, alentar las obras de caridad y la comunión fraterna dentro de la Iglesia y en la sociedad y para llamar a los cristianos a ser más sinceros y coherentes en su fe en Cristo, el único Salvador.

Retorno al Tiempo Ordinario

"Este domingo comenzamos el tiempo litúrgico del Tiempo Ordinario. Durante muchos domingos de este ciclo, nuestras lecturas serán tomadas del Evangelio de Lucas. De vez en cuando, sin embargo, leeremos del Evangelio de Juan. Es el caso del Evangelio de hoy, que describe el comienzo del ministerio de Jesús y su primer milagro.

Para situar la lectura de hoy dentro del contexto del Evangelio de Juan, notamos que el relato de Juan de este evento sigue el llamado de Jesús a sus primeros discípulos. Juan nos dice que Jesús y sus discípulos fueron invitados a estas bodas en Caná, al igual que la madre de Jesús, María.

En la historia litúrgica de la Iglesia, las bodas de Caná están estrechamente asociadas con el bautismo del Señor y la adoración del niño Jesús por los Reyes Magos. En este contexto, el signo que Jesús realiza en el banquete de bodas se celebra como una epifanía o una manifestación de la divinidad de Jesús.

El matrimonio y las fiestas de bodas son metáforas utilizadas en las Escrituras para describir la salvación de Dios y el Reino de Dios. Aquí, al comienzo del ministerio público de Jesús, el Evangelio de Juan busca establecer que Jesús va a reinterpretar y cumplir la promesa de Yahweh a Israel. Jesús establece el Nuevo Pacto. Una pista de cómo será este Nuevo Pacto se hace evidente en la obra que Jesús realiza. Cuando se le pidió que hiciera algo para abordar la incómoda situación que crearía la ausencia de vino en un banquete de bodas, el milagro de Jesús produce grandes cantidades de vino: seis tinajas con treinta galones cada una se llenan a rebosar con vino selecto.

Esta espléndida respuesta a una simple necesidad humana es para nosotros una visión de la abundancia del reino de Dios. Nos desafía a responder con generosidad cuando nos enfrentamos a las necesidades humanas de hoy. Respondemos lo mejor que podemos, con plena confianza en que Dios puede transformar nuestros esfuerzos, llevando el Reino de Dios a su cumplimiento entre nosotros". (loyolapress.com)

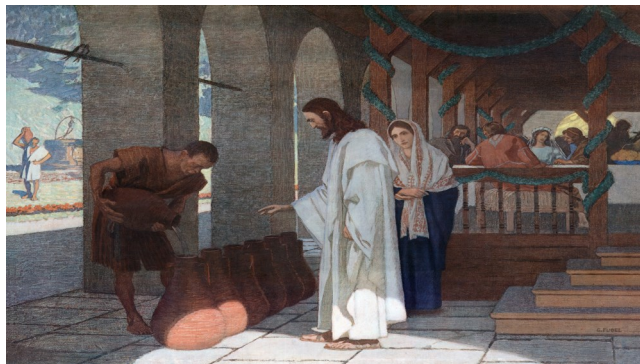

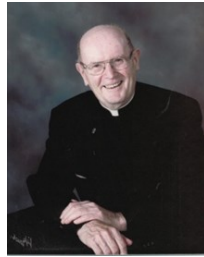

Saint Agnes

Saint of the Week—January 21

Writing about Saint Agnes in the year 377, Saint Ambrose, Bishop of Milan, declared: “This is a virgin’s birthday into heaven: let us imitate her chastity! And a martyr’s heavenly birthday: let us offer ourselves in sacrifice!” Chastity: mastery of oneself in order to give of oneself whether in the priestly, religious, married, or single state. Sacrifice: “to make holy,” to set someone or something apart for service.

Ambrose knew these virtues indispensable for discipleship, but challenging to practice in his world—or our own. Barely a teenager, Agnes faced gruesome tortures bravely and, when ordered to worship pagan gods, boldly made the Sign of the Cross instead. Thus, her youthful courage strengthened adult believers who wavered under persecution or grew indifferent when persecutions passed.

To bestow on Agnes its highest honor and keep her witness fresh in believers’ hearts, the Church inscribed her name at the heart of the Eucharistic liturgy, in the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I), until Vatican II the Roman Church’s only Eucharistic Prayer.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

We have the wedding at Cana at the heart of today's liturgy because this story of Jesus' first miracle of water turned into wine was originally part of the Epiphany feast.

Wedding celebrations always require some savvy planning, and a people who have a talent for hospitality in the mix. The mother of Jesus has been recruited to deal with some of the details of the banquet, and when a very understandable crisis arises, she does what she can to rescue the party. Anyone who has ever run out of ice, dessert, or table settings knows the stress!

Slowly, the memory of Jesus Christ's blessing of this marriage feast led the Church to form a way to bless marriages. A thousand years ago weddings migrated from the family home to the doors of the church, where the celebration was held in public view. From this practice came a prayer called the "Nuptial Blessing," one of the most solemn prayers in our tradition.

It is very much like the prayers by which baptismal water and chrisam are consecrated, the ordination prayer over a priest, and the Eucharistic Prayers over bread and wine. Four hundred fifty years ago, weddings moved inside the church building.

All of this gives married couples good reason to celebrate this day as a mini-anniversary, especially with the clinking of glasses filled with good wine.

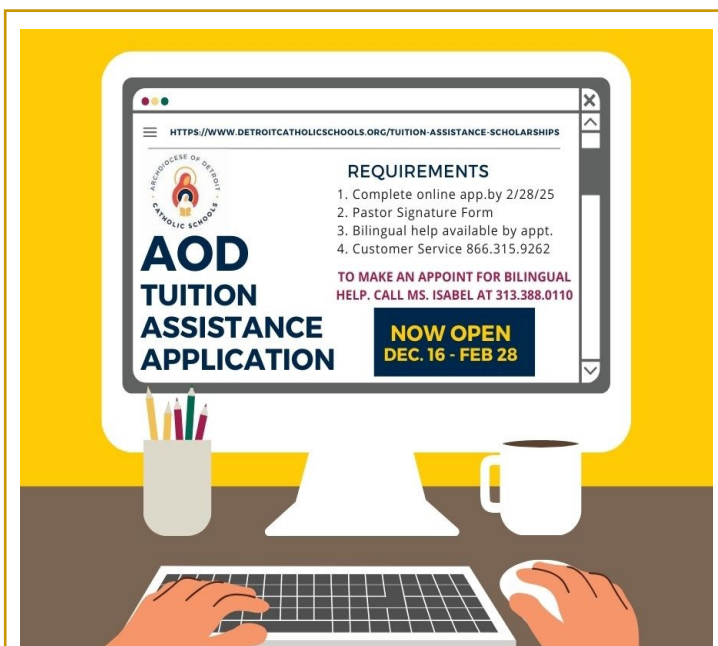

January: *Advocacy*

Our Jubilee Year is a time for renewal, forgiveness, and hope. Pope Francis has called for Us Catholics to be "signs of hope" in the world, as a family of parishes we are going to dedicate this month to Advocacy.

·Debt Forgiveness

The Catholic Church's charitable arm launched a campaign in 160 countries to cancel foreign debt.

Pope Francis made debt forgiveness a central theme of this year's Jubilee as well. "The first to forgive debts is God, as we always ask him when we pray the Lord's Prayer, referring to our sins and committing ourselves to forgive in turn those who have offended us," The Pope said. "And the Jubilee asks us to translate this forgiveness on a social level, so that no person, no family, no population is crushed by debts. I therefore encourage the rulers of countries with a Christian tradition to set a good example by canceling or reducing as much as possible the debts of the poorest countries."

The Pope's encouragement helps bring the world's attention to the issue, but it is the hard work of groups like Jubilee USA that makes debt relief a reality. It is complicated stuff.

Whatever our economic problems here in America, we cannot even imagine the desperation of those living in extreme poverty. But we can do something about it.

Since the year 1300, and every 25 years thereafter, the people of God have celebrated a Jubilee Year as a special gift of grace. The theme for Jubilee 2025 is "Pilgrims of Hope," and it will be a year of hope for a world suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing effects of illness, and the climate crisis. This calendar from the Vatican, will inform the focus of our parish commemorations throughout this Jubilee Year.
