Welcome Lent

This Wednesday we begin the sacred journey of lent. As this spiritual season always provides an opportunity to focus our sacrificial disciplines towards a life-changing paschal encounter with Christ through His Passion, Death, and

Resurrection, I pray we'll collectively use this time to pray for our fellow parishioners and parishes during this time of transition. Charity, patience, and the gifts of Holy Spirit, most especially Wisdom, Right Judgement, and Understanding, will be what properly assists our emotional response to be that of a Christian engaged in the sacred journey of faith on this earth, in preparation for the eternal one that awaits us.

Frequently Asked Questions Regarding Changes to Our Parishes

Will I still be able to celebrate a wedding, funeral, baptism, etc. at my home parish?

- Yes. Nothing has changed in regard to your ability to celebrate these significant celebrations in the parish which you are a registered member. This is also true for First Holy Communion as well.

What will happen to Mass intentions that were scheduled for Masses that are now canceled or changed?

- For a daily mass intention originally scheduled for a Mass day that has been canceled, it will be transferred to the corresponding Mass day at St. Frances Cabrini.

- For a weekend Mass intention, if on a Saturday Vigil Mass, it will be transferred to the lone Saturday Mass at St. Frances Cabrini. For a Sunday Mass intention, it will 'stay' with the Mass it was originally scheduled for, but at the new time. For example, if you scheduled a Mass intention for the 10am Mass at St. Constance, it will be celebrated at the new Sunday Mass time of 11 am.

Can I use my parish envelope at other churches?

- Yes. All parish envelopes can be used at any of our six locations. They will always be sent to the correct Church to be counted with their weekend offering, although it will more than likely be included in the collection total for the next week.

What does it mean to be an active and registered parishioner?

- To be registered and active is two-fold. First, the registration means you have filled out the appropriate registration form, submitted it to the parish office, and received envelopes. A simple way to know you are registered is if you have received mailings from the parish.

- To be active means that you are using your envelopes or on-line giving, volunteering in the many service

opportunities provided, or most importantly, attending weekend Mass on a regular basis. It is very important to use your envelopes or on-line giving each week, as this is the only way it can be verified that you are attending Mass.

Why are we doing all these changes now?

- From the data shared at each of the twenty-two Listening Session Presentations (cabriniparish.org) and given the fact that the entire Archdiocese is now undergoing a wholesale reorganization plan as announced in the No Second Tunic Pastoral Note (aod.org) from the Archbishop, our number of priests and active parishioners is rapidly declining. This has been a decades long trend, but we can no longer ignore this reality nor continue to do 'business as usual' when it comes to the 'practice of the faith.' The good news is that we still have a very vibrant Church, access to all the sacraments, the continual presence of the many ministries, groups, and organizations from each of our parishes. While it will look and feel different, it will still be present.

Fin de Semana en Birney's

Bienvenida Cuaresma

Este miércoles comenzamos el sagrado camino de la Cuaresma. Como esta temporada espiritual siempre brinda una oportunidad para enfocar nuestras disciplinas sacrificiales hacia un encuentro pascual con Cristo que cambia la vida de la vida a través de Su Pasión, Muerte y Resurrección, oro para que aprovechemos colectivamente este tiempo para orar por nuestros compañeros feligreses y parroquias durante este tiempo de transición. La caridad, la paciencia y los dones del Espíritu Santo, muy especialmente la Sabiduría, el Juicio Correcto y el Entendimiento, serán los que asistan adecuadamente a nuestra respuesta emocional para que sea la de un cristiano comprometido en el sagrado viaje de la fe en esta tierra, en preparación para el eterno que nos espera.

Preguntas Frecuentes Sobre Cambios en Nuestras Parroquias

¿Podré seguir celebrando una boda, funeral, bautizo, etc. en mi parroquia de origen?

- Sí. Nada ha cambiado con respecto a su capacidad para celebrar estas celebraciones significativas en la parroquia de la que es miembro registrado. Esto también es cierto para la Primera Comunión.

¿Qué pasará con las intenciones de Misa que estaban programadas para Misas que ahora están canceladas o cambiadas?

- Para una intención de misa diaria originalmente programada para un día de misa que ha sido cancelado, se transferirá al día de misa correspondiente en Santa Francisca Cabrini.

- Para una intención de misa de fin de semana, si se trata de una misa de vigilia de sábado, se transferirá a la única misa de sábado en Santa Francisca Cabrini. Para una intención de misa dominical, se "mantendrá" con la misa para la que estaba programada originalmente, pero a la nueva hora. Por ejemplo, si programó una intención de misa para la misa de las 10 a.m. en Santa Constanza, se celebrará a la nueva hora de la misa dominical de las 11 a.m.

¿Puedo usar el sobre de mi parroquia en otras iglesias?

- Sí. Todos los sobres parroquiales se pueden usar en cualquiera de nuestras seis iglesias. Siempre se enviarán a la Iglesia correcta para que se cuenten con su ofrenda de fin de semana, aunque lo más probable es que se incluya en el total de la colecta para la próxima semana.

¿Qué significa ser un feligrés activo y registrado?

- Ser miembro registrado y activo tiene dos significados. Primero, la inscripción significa que ha completado el formulario de inscripción correspondiente, lo ha enviado

a la oficina parroquial y ha recibido sobres. Una forma sencilla de saber que está registrado es si ha recibido correos de la parroquia.

- Ser miembro activo significa que estás usando tus sobres o donando en línea, ofreciéndote como voluntario en las muchas oportunidades de servicio que se brindan o, lo que es más importante, asistiendo a la Misa de fin de semana de manera regular. Es muy importante usar tus sobres o dar en línea cada semana, ya que esta es la única manera de verificar que está asistiendo a Misa.

¿Por qué estamos haciendo todos estos cambios ahora?

- A partir de los datos compartidos en cada una de las veintidós Presentaciones de la Sesión de Escucha (cabriniparish.org) y dado el hecho de que toda la Arquidiócesis está ahora en un plan de reorganización total como se anunció en la Nota Pastoral de la Túnica (aod.org) del Arzobispo, nuestro número de sacerdotes y feligreses activos está disminuyendo rápidamente. Esta ha sido una tendencia de décadas, pero ya no podemos ignorar esta realidad ni continuar haciendo 'lo de siempre' cuando se trata de la 'práctica de la fe'. La buena noticia es que todavía tenemos una Iglesia muy vibrante, acceso a todos los sacramentos, la presencia continua de los muchos ministerios, grupos y organizaciones de cada una de nuestras parroquias. Si bien se verá y se sentirá diferente, aún estará presente.

Pero para producirlos se requiere la integridad y la pureza de corazón que se encuentran en el maestro. Cuando la gente vea tus buenas obras, sabrán que esto se debe a que tienes un buen corazón." 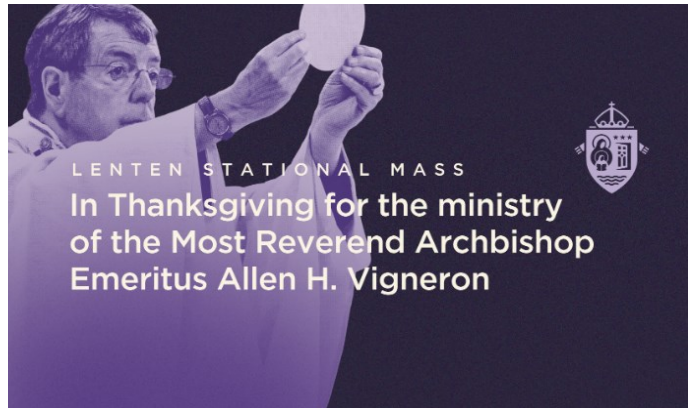
