Mass and Office Schedule changes for next Weekend

This is a reminder that next week.... Palm Sunday weekend.... the new office, daily and weekend mass schedule will take effect.

As we have been advertising for several weeks, the new schedule can be found on page 4 of the bulletin.

Change is rarely easy, and I am aware of how difficult these specific changes will be for many of you. I wish I could say that this will be the last time that we will face the need for changes to take place among our parishes, but that would not be an honest statement. As we do our best to effectively plan for the future of our Church, one that will feel and look different on many levels, but remain the same in focus and mission, we must be realistic about what we can reasonably offer, based on a declining population of parishioners and priests.

For now, these changes to our offices and liturgical schedules, will provide a healthier ministry environment for the priests and maintain the majority of individual parish programs. Remember, if there are people to attend and offer their time, talent and treasure, every program, ministry, group, club, gathering, social event, or prayer group is still active and present at each parish. None of that is changing. Perhaps if we allow ourselves to focus on what we still have, and not just on the few things that are changing, a more optimistic acceptance will take root.

Let us pray for one another and for an infusion of the gifts of the Holy Spirit: Wisdom, Knowledge, Courage, Right Judgement, and Understanding, to guide us through these new paths to holiness.

Fifth Sunday of Lent Reflection

"The Gospel for the fifth Sunday of Lent continues to offer lessons about God's mercy and forgiveness. Last Sunday we heard the Parable of the Prodigal Son from the Gospel of Luke. Today we hear not a parable, but the report from John's Gospel of an encounter among Jesus, the scribes and Pharisees, and a woman caught in adultery.

Today's Gospel begins by reporting that Jesus is again teaching the crowds in the vicinity of the Temple. The scribes and the Pharisees approach Jesus, bringing a woman who has been caught in the act of adultery.

They put to Jesus the question of what ought to be done in this case.

The Pharisees state clearly that according to the Law of Moses, those caught in the act of adultery were to be stoned to death. Under Roman occupation, however, the Jewish people did not have the authority to execute people; this is cited in John's passion narrative. To answer the Pharisees' question, Jesus must propose an action that will be either contrary to the Law of Moses or contrary to Roman law. Either answer, yes or no, will support the Pharisees' case against Jesus.

Jesus avoids the trap, however, by offering an answer that was not anticipated by those who posed the question. Jesus, after writing on the ground with his finger, addresses those who stand before him and suggests that the one without sin cast the first stone. Jesus then returns to his writing.

We can easily imagine the scene as the Pharisees and the elders disperse, one by one. Jesus has eluded the trap they had prepared. We might also give credit to the elders and the Pharisees who do not, in the end, claim to be sinless and worthy of passing judgment.

Jesus' response to those who accuse the woman is more than a caution to us about making judgment of others. It is a profound lesson in divine mercy and forgiveness. As sinners, we are all unworthy to judge the sins of others and we would stand convicted by God for our transgressions. Yet Jesus, the one without sin and thus our judge, offers us who are sinners his mercy and forgiveness. Redeemed by Jesus' compassion, we are sent to sin no more and to live in God's love and peace." Nada de eso va a cambiar. Quizás si nos permitimos centrarnos en lo que aún tenemos, y no solo en las pocas cosas que están cambiando, se arraigará una aceptación más optimista.

Oremos los unos por los otros y por una infusión de los dones del Espíritu Santo: Sabiduría, Conocimiento, Coraje, Recto Juicio y Entendimiento, para guiarnos a través de estos nuevos caminos hacia la santidad.

Quinto Domingo de Cuaresma Reflexión

"El Evangelio del quinto domingo de Cuaresma sigue ofreciendo lecciones sobre la misericordia y el perdón de Dios. El domingo pasado escuchamos la parábola del hijo pródigo del Evangelio de Lucas. Hoy no escuchamos una parábola, sino el relato del Evangelio de Juan de un encuentro entre Jesús, los escribas y fariseos, y una mujer sorprendida en adulterio.

El Evangelio de hoy comienza informando que Jesús está enseñando de nuevo a las multitudes en las cercanías del Templo. Los escribas y los fariseos se acercan a Jesús, trayendo a una mujer que ha sido sorprendida en el acto de adulterio. Le plantearon a Jesús la pregunta de lo que debía hacerse en este caso. Los fariseos declaran claramente que, según la Ley de Moisés, los que fueran sorprendidos en el acto de adulterio debían ser apedreados hasta la muerte. Sin embargo, bajo la ocupación romana, el pueblo judío no tenía autoridad para ejecutar a las personas; esto se cita en la narración de la pasión de Juan. Para responder a la pregunta de los fariseos, Jesús debe proponer una acción que sea contraria a la Ley de Moisés o contraria a la ley romana. Cualquiera de las dos respuestas, sí o no, apoyará el caso de los fariseos contra Jesús.

Sin embargo, Jesús evita la trampa ofreciendo una respuesta que no fue anticipada por aquellos que plantearon la pregunta. Jesús, después de escribir en el suelo con su dedo, se dirige a los que están delante de él y sugiere que el que esté libre de pecado tire la primera piedra. Entonces Jesús vuelve a su escritura.

Podemos imaginar fácilmente la escena mientras los fariseos y los ancianos se dispersan, uno por uno. Jesús ha eludido la trampa que habían preparado. También podríamos dar crédito a los ancianos y a los fariseos que, al final, no afirman estar libres de pecado y ser dignos de juicio.

La respuesta de Jesús a aquellos que acusan a la mujer es más que una advertencia para nosotros acerca de juzgar a los demás. Es una profunda lección de misericordia divina y perdón. Como pecadores, todos somos indignos de juzgar los pecados de los demás y seríamos condenados por Dios por nuestras transgresiones. Sin embargo, Jesús, el que está libre de pecado y, por lo tanto, nuestro juez, nos ofrece a nosotros, que somos pecadores, su misericordia y su perdón. Redimidos por la compasión de Jesús, somos enviados a no pecar más y a vivir en el amor y la paz de Dios". (loyolapress.com)

Upcoming Celebration St. Alfred | April 16 | 7:00pm



St. Dymphna was an Irish virgin martyr who is revered as the patron saint of people with mental disorders and epilepsy and victims of incest. Her feast day is celebrated on May 15.

Devotion to St. Dymphna spurred a unique community centered approach to

treating people living with mental health conditions in the Belgian town where she was martyred. In the late 20th and early 21st centuries, reverence for Dymphna grew with greater awareness of issues concerning mental health.

"Lord, we pray for those who have a mental illness. Help us to understand that the way that we talk about people with a mental illness affects the people themselves and how we treat the illness. So often people who have a mental illness are known as their illness; people say that "she is bipolar" or "he is schizophrenic"; when we talk about mental illness we should not use that phrase. People who have cancer are not cancer; those with heart disease are not heart disease. Let us always remember that people with mental illness are not the illness-they are beautiful creations of God.

There is so much fear, ignorance and hurtful attitudes that the people who suffer from mental illness needlessly suffer further. Help us to support and be compassionate to those with a mental illness, every bit as much as we support those who suffer from any other illness.

Grant courage to those for whom we pray and fill them with hope. If it is according to Your Divine Will, grant them the recovery and cure they desire. Help them to remember You love them; they are never alone.

Saint Dymphna, Patron of those with a Mental Illness, pray for us."



Fifth Sunday of Lent

God's Justice

The story of Jesus and the woman caught in adultery is sometimes considered as a put-down of the scribes and Pharisees. While their motive for bringing the woman to Jesus was to test him, they were technically trying to uphold the law. But they were hoping to get Jesus to cause a scandal by refuting the law, or, if he upheld the law, the woman would be killed with Jesus' approval. Jesus had a better idea. He shows that God's justice is mercy and forgiveness. When he told them that the one without sin could be first to throw a stone, he knew that they all were sinners one way or another. And a sinner could not judge another sinner. He also knew that someone whose sins were forgiven would be willing to forgive the woman.

That's what St. Paul means in the second reading when he says he did not have "any righteousness of my own based on the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ" (Philippians 3:9). He says he has given up the idea of making himself righteous (right with God) by keeping the laws of his people. Now he depends on his faith in Christ and Christ's forgiveness, which was shown in his death and resurrection. He is even willing to follow Christ in suffering and eventually death, so that he too can share the Resurrection. Why did Paul come to this kind of faith? Because he had been forgiven for persecuting Christians. And he had persecuted them, not because he was evil, but because he thought he was keeping the law.

Jesus probably surprised the woman when he let her go. He was the only one who could have judged her, but he chose to forgive. Just as the woman was changed by the mercy of Christ, Paul too was affected by being forgiven by the One whom he was persecuting (Acts 9:4).

So is keeping the law a bad thing? No, but the important thing is why we keep the law. We can do it like the Pharisees—keeping the law as a status symbol: "I'm too good (or too important) to break the law." Or we can choose to follow Jesus' way of love. Then we still keep the laws and commandments, only because they are examples of how to love God and love each other. For we too have been forgiven by Jesus on the cross.

As we approach Holy Week, let us remember how much Jesus has done for us.

Lift Up Your Hearts

In the Gospel today the Scribes and the Pharisees try to catch Jesus in a violation of the law of Moses, which commanded that the woman caught in adultery should be stoned to death. They brought the woman before Jesus and said, "So what do You say???" Jesus stood up and said to the Pharisees:

"Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her."

Jesus stayed with His plan of forgiveness.... He paused and doodled on the ground....and one by one they all walked away in their own truth.

The woman standing there in front of Jesus must have truly been troubled, nervous and worried.... Yet, her heart was somehow touched by the love that she saw in Jesus, when He asked her: "Where are they, has no one condemned you?"

She must have seen the love and forgiveness in the heart of Jesus when He said:

"Go, and from now on do not sin anymore." Jesus knows our hearts.... With all that we are sorry about, and how we truly want to change.

Lent is a time of special grace and His forgiveness in the sacrament of reconciliation. Take time for it when the time is right for you. Have a talk with the person that you look at in the mirror.... Just be honest.

There is a right time for everything.
