Welcome Letter from Fr. Stephen



Hello everyone!

I am so excited to arrive at this amazing group of parishes and to jump right into the great work that is going on. My first week here has truly been blessed and I am extremely thankful for your very warm welcome.

While I know that I am stepping into the big shoes of Fr. Ryan and Fr. Roberto, I am excited for the challenge and to learn from all of you. Some of you might remember me a bit as I had the privilege of spending a good amount of time at St. Frances Cabrini as one of the residents of the Chateau during the pandemic and on some breaks from the seminary. In addition to that, I temporarily lived at St. Mary Magdalen for a month after I was ordained, before I started my first assignment. It is nice that I am a bit familiar with some of you, but I do ask for your patience (and forgiveness in advance!) because remembering names is not a strong skill of mine!

Since I already know a little about you, it's only fair you get to know some information about me too. I was ordained in May of 2024 and have just finished my second year of priesthood. I am 29 years old (still one of the youngest priests in the Archdiocese.) I grew up in Livonia and my home parish was St. Kenneth in Plymouth. Both of my parents live in Livonia, and I am blessed that my three siblings live in the Metro Detroit area as well. I am also blessed to have three beautiful nieces, Alma, Nora and Harper, who I am able to see frequently.

I attended Livonia Stevenson High School and then went to Michigan State University for one year before I entered Sacred Heart Major Seminary. I spent eight years in the seminary and it was a great time of fraternity and formation. Please continue to pray for our Detroit seminarians and for more young men to join them in the ranks, because it truly is an incredible and life-fulfilling calling.

The downriver area is not new to me, as my grandparents lived in Trenton and I have an aunt and uncle in Wyandotte, so many of the places are familiar to me. For the past two years I was assigned to St. John Vianney in Shelby Township, basically the other end of the world compared to here!

St. John Vianney is a very vibrant parish, hosting lots of weddings and baptisms due to a lot of new homes being built in the area. I have loved walking with people during these great joys in their lives. A passion of mine is working with the youth of our parishes. I did start a youth group at St. John Vianney and it was a lot of fun.

I also enjoyed ministering to college students coming home for the summer or breaks. I was blessed to spend time catching up with them, hearing how their journeys have been going, and offering any advice I can give. So, if you are in any of those categories, I look forward to meeting you and talking a bit and feel free to start a conversation about anything you might have on your mind!

Some things I enjoy are bike riding, hiking, walking, and anything that gets me outside to enjoy all that God has created. As of last month, I have walked a portion of the Camino in Spain twice now and I absolutely love doing it. So, I will take any recommendations of trails and spots to check out in this area. I look forward to getting to know all of you. I do want to apologize again because I am not the best at remembering names, but I will try my best.

Since I was told of this assignment back in April I have been praying for Fr. John, Fr. Johnson, and all of you every day. I will continue to pray for you as we begin to get to know each other. Please pray for me, as starting somewhere new is a bit intimidating, especially four places and a school! But I know one thing is true: "I Can Do All Things Through Christ Who Strengthens Me."

Carta de Bienvenida del Padre Stephen

Hola a todos!

Me entusiasma mucho llegar a este maravilloso grupo de parroquias y sumergirme de lleno en la gran labor que aquí se realiza. Mi primera semana ha sido verdaderamente bendecida y les agradezco profundamente la cálida bienvenida que me han brindado. Aunque soy consciente de que asumo una gran responsabilidad al suceder al Padre Ryan y al Padre Roberto, afronto el reto con ilusión y con ganas de aprender de todos ustedes. Es posible que algunos me recuerden, ya que tuve el privilegio de pasar bastante tiempo en St. Frances Cabrini residiendo en el “Chateau” durante la pandemia y en algunos periodos de descanso del seminario.

Además, viví temporalmente en St. Mary Magdalen durante un mes tras mi ordenación, antes de comenzar mi primer destino pastoral. Me alegra conocer ya a algunos de ustedes, pero les pido paciencia (¡y perdón de antemano!), ya que recordar nombres no es precisamente mi fuerte.

Ya que sé un poco sobre ustedes, es justo que también conozcan algo sobre mí. Fui ordenado en mayo de 2024 y acabo de terminar mi segundo año de sacerdocio. Tengo 29 años (sigo siendo uno de los sacerdotes más jóvenes de la Arquidiócesis). Crecí en Livonia y mi parroquia de origen era St. Kenneth, en Plymouth. Mis padres viven en Livonia y tengo la bendición de que mis tres hermanos también residen en el área metropolitana de Detroit.

También tengo la dicha de contar con tres sobrinas maravillosas Alma, Nora y Harper a quienes puedo ver con frecuencia. Asistí a la escuela secundaria Livonia Stevenson y cursé estudios en la Universidad Estatal de Michigan durante un año antes de ingresar al Seminario Mayor del Sagrado Corazón. Pasé ocho años en el seminario; fue una etapa magnífica de fraternidad y formación. Por favor, sigan rezando por nuestros seminaristas de Detroit y para que más jóvenes se unan a ellos, ya que es, verdaderamente, una vocación increíble y plenamente gratificante.

La zona de Downriver no me es desconocida, ya que mis abuelos vivían en Trenton y tengo tíos en Wyandotte, por lo que muchos de los lugares me resultan familiares. Durante los últimos dos años estuve asignado a la parroquia de St. John Vianney en Shelby Township; ¡prácticamente el otro extremo del mundo en comparación con este lugar! St. John Vianney es una parroquia muy dinámica donde se celebran numerosas bodas y bautizos, debido a la gran cantidad de viviendas nuevas que se están construyendo en la zona. Ha sido un placer para mí acompañar a las personas durante estos momentos de gran alegría en sus vidas. Una de mis pasiones es trabajar con los jóvenes de nuestras

parroquias; de hecho, formé un grupo juvenil en St. John Vianney y fue una experiencia muy divertida. También disfruté mucho atendiendo a los estudiantes universitarios que regresaban a casa durante el verano o las vacaciones. Fue una bendición poder ponerme al día con ellos, escuchar cómo avanzaban en sus caminos y ofrecerles los consejos que estuvieran a mi alcance. Así que, si te encuentras en alguna de estas situaciones, espero conocerte y conversar un poco contigo; ¡no dudes en iniciar una charla sobre cualquier tema que tengas en mente!

Entre las cosas que disfruto están andar en bicicleta, el senderismo, las caminatas y cualquier actividad que me permita estar al aire libre y disfrutar de todo lo que Dios ha creado. Hasta el mes pasado, ya había recorrido dos veces una parte del Camino en España, y es algo que me encanta hacer. Por eso, agradeceré cualquier recomendación sobre senderos y lugares interesantes de esta zona. Tengo muchas ganas de conocerlos a todos. Quiero pedir disculpas de antemano, ya que no se me da muy bien recordar nombres, pero haré todo lo posible por lograrlo.

Desde que se me informó sobre este nombramiento el pasado mes de abril, he estado rezando todos los días por el Padre John, el Padre Johnson y por todos ustedes. Seguiré rezando por ustedes a medida que comencemos a conocernos. Por favor, recen por mí, ya que empezar en un lugar nuevo impone un poco de respeto, ¡especialmente tratándose de cuatro centros y una escuela! Pero sé que una cosa es cierta: “Todo lo puedo en Cristo que me fortalece.”

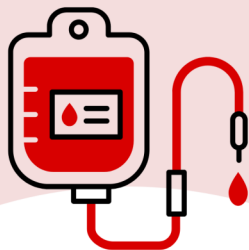
Theme: Living a Life that Matters: What the Sermon on the Mount Teaches Us about Stewardship

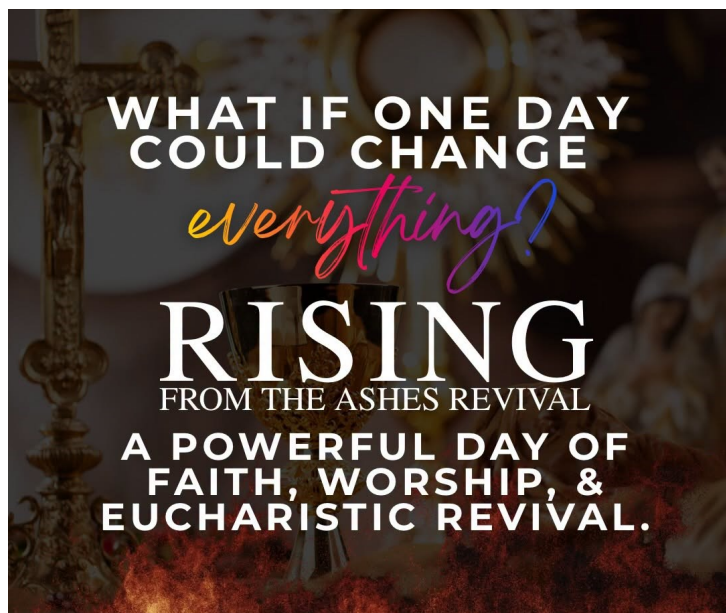

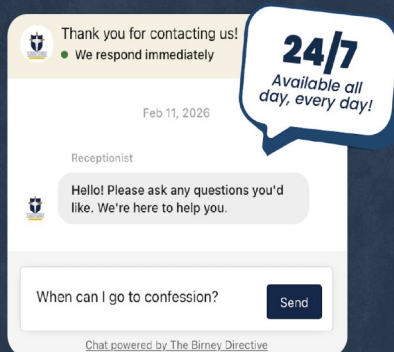

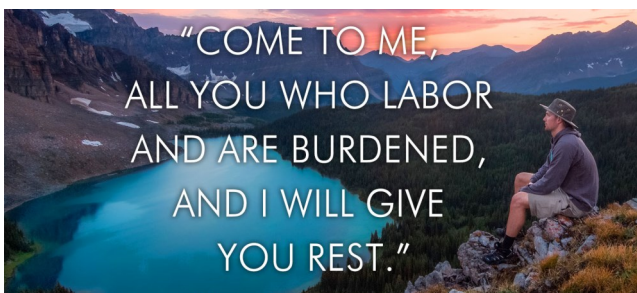

Meek and Humble God

Jesus tells us in today's Gospel that he is "meek and humble of heart." Yet just a few lines before this, he says that he is equal to his Father, the almighty God. So how can the Son of God be both meek and mighty?

For Jesus, being meek does not mean letting people push him around. If he were meek in that sense, he could not have thrown the moneychangers out of the temple. Jesus' meekness meant doing the will of God completely. The challenge for us comes in his words "learn from me." We must learn to do God's will as completely as Jesus did.

First, it means that we do all that God wants of us. We cannot pick and choose what we want to do and what we want to ignore. If some things seem too difficult or painful for us, we may need more faith in Jesus' ability to make the burden easy. For example, sometimes we may hear Jesus' command to love one another and reserve the right to love whom we choose. Or we may reserve the right to decide which teachings of the Church we will follow. But doing God's will completely means doing it without reservation.

Second, we may try to do all that God asks, but give up if something becomes too difficult. We may say we forgive someone, for example, but when they reject that forgiveness, we become even angrier. Or we may tire of being patient with someone and be verbally hurtful. Or maybe we agree to help on a parish project but quit when someone disagrees with us. We can learn from Jesus how to do each part of God's will to completion, as Jesus did all the way to the cross.

So how is the Son of God humble? True humility means acknowledging who we are and what we can do. Jesus is simply being humble when he says that he is equal to the Father. So too, we are humble when we do not hide the fact that we are children of God and brothers and sisters of Jesus. Instead of a false modesty that claims "I'm not good enough to follow all of God's commands," it takes true humility to accept that we can do God's will because the Spirit is with us to help us.

Stroke Awareness Month

Every May, Stroke Awareness Month provides a powerful opportunity to shine a spotlight on stroke prevention, recognition, and support. Whether you're a survivor, caregiver, or concerned community member, this month is dedicated to raising awareness, spotlighting advances in treatment and recovery, and sparking action that saves lives. In this article, we'll cover key themes of Stroke Awareness Month—from the importance of recognizing early warning signs and managing risk factors, to sharing real-life survivor stories and ways you can get involved. Let's come together to educate, advocate, and bring hope to anyone touched by stroke.

What Is a Stroke?

A stroke happens when blood flow to the brain is interrupted—either by a blocked blood vessel (ischemic stroke) or bleeding in the brain (hemorrhagic stroke). Without a steady supply of oxygen, brain cells begin to die within minutes. That's why every second counts.

How Common Is Stroke?

Every 40 seconds, someone in the U.S. has a stroke. Every 4 minutes, someone dies from a stroke. More than 6.5 million Americans are stroke survivors. Stroke is also a leading cause of long-term disability. Recovery can be long and complex, especially without access to therapies and ongoing care.

Risk Factors for Stroke

While stroke can affect anyone at any age, some risk factors increase your chances of having one: Managing these conditions—and knowing your numbers—can help prevent stroke before it starts.

High blood pressure, Diabetes, Smoking, High cholesterol, Obesity, Heart disease or atrial fibrillation, Family or personal history of stroke or TIA (“mini-stroke”)

Learn the Signs: BE FAST

Recognizing the symptoms of a stroke early and calling for help immediately can save a life. Use the BE FAST acronym to remember the warning signs:

B – Balance: Is the person suddenly dizzy, off-balance, or unable to coordinate movements?

E – Eyes: Is there sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes?

F – Face drooping: Does one side of the face droop or feel numb? Ask them to smile.

A – Arm weakness: Is one arm weak or numb? Ask them to raise both arms.

S – Speech difficulty: Is their speech slurred or hard to understand? Ask them to repeat a simple sentence.

T – Time to call 911: If someone shows any of these symptoms, call 911 right away.

Time-sensitive treatments like clot-busting medications or procedures can only be given within a few hours of symptom onset. Don't wait to see if symptoms improve—call for help immediately.
