My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This weekend we are celebrating the Solemnity of Saint Anne, the patroness of the Archdiocese of Detroit, at all of our Masses. Her feast day is July 26th. Since this date falls on a Sunday this year, we will have the readings for her feast day rather than the

readings for the 17th Sunday of Ordinary Time. Why is Ste. Anne, the grandmother of Jesus, the patroness of our archdiocese? The City of Detroit was founded by the French explorer, Antoine Cadillac, on July 24, 1701. Two days later on July 26th, which is the feast day of St. Anne, the first parish of Detroit was founded. It was named, not surprisingly, after St. Anne, to whom the French traditionally had a strong devotion. The Basilica of St. Anne is the second longest continually running parish in the United States after Saint Augustine in Florida. It makes sense that St. Anne is our archdiocese's patroness. A blessed Solemnity of St. Anne to all of you. May she intercede for our families, our parishes and our archdiocese.

Archdiocesan Restructuring Process

St. Frances Cabrini Festival Results

I am happy to announce that the Cabrini festival made a profit of \$184,587.37 this year. This is tremendous. It's a bit lower than in some previous years. Parishioners who have more experience than I do in these matters said our numbers may have been down a bit because of the

rain that we had that Friday evening. Nonetheless, this is a super important fundraiser for the parish. Thanks be to God!

I am grateful to everyone at St. Frances Cabrini for the many ways in which all of you supported our parish festival. I'm also grateful for the many parishioners from our other Quo Vadis Family parishes who came specifically to offer support to another parish in our family of parishes. There were many people, parishioners and folks from throughout the Downriver Area, who came and had a good time at the festival. That's what we want. Nobody would have come and had a good time, and the festival would not have been such a success without the many volunteers, young and older and in between, who worked so hard in so many ways before, during and after the festival. Volunteers who helped with set-up and take down, hospitality, food, beverages, musical entertainment, games, raffles, trash removal, security, prayer, etc. A special thank you to all of the different chair couples and individuals for the different booths and responsibilities at the festival. A big thank you as well to our festival chair couple, Tiffany and Rory Cogswell, for their outstanding leadership and their months of work on our festival. They have been the chairs of our festival for the past eight years. We are grateful to them for a job well done for many years! Next year's festival will be June 11-13, 2027. We'll see you there!

El Diario del Padre John

Mis hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

Este fin de semana celebramos la Solemnidad de Santa Ana, patrona de la Arquidiócesis de Detroit, en todas nuestras Misas. Su fiesta se celebra el 26 de julio. Dado que este año dicha fecha cae en domingo, utilizaremos las lecturas propias de su fiesta en lugar de las correspondientes al 17.º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. ¿Por qué Santa Ana, la abuela de Jesús, es la patrona de nuestra arquidiócesis? La ciudad de Detroit fue fundada por el explorador francés Antoine Cadillac el 24 de julio de 1701. Dos días más tarde, el 26 de julio —día de la fiesta de Santa Ana—, se fundó la primera parroquia de Detroit. Como era de esperar, recibió el nombre de Santa Ana, santa a quien los franceses profesaban tradicionalmente una gran devoción. La Basílica de Santa Ana es la segunda parroquia con funcionamiento ininterrumpido más antigua de los Estados Unidos, después de la de San Agustín en Florida. Tiene todo el sentido que Santa Ana sea la patrona de nuestra arquidiócesis. ¡Que tengan todos una bendecida Solemnidad de Santa Ana! Que ella interceda por nuestras familias, nuestras parroquias y nuestra arquidiócesis.

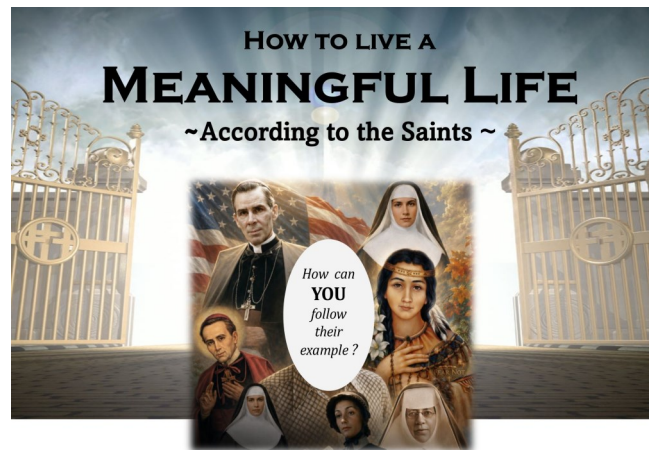

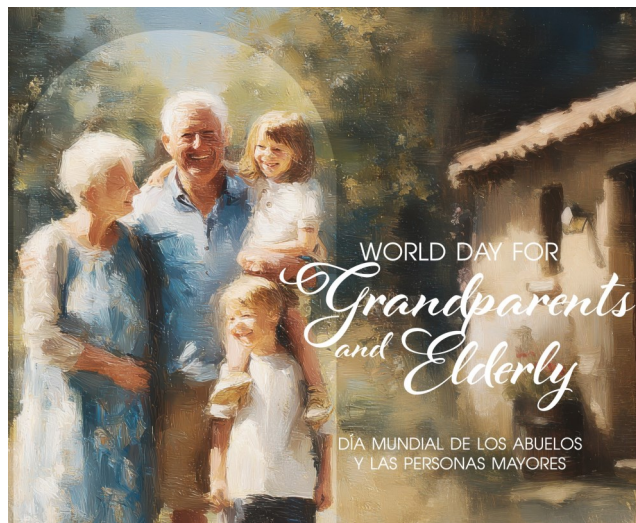

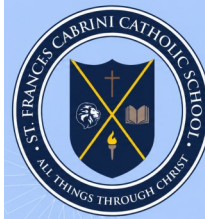

It was good to see everyone enjoying themselves. Thank you also to the people who helped with the Restructuring Surveys. Our T-shirt sale has ended. We expect the shirts to be in the first part of August.

Did You Know?

During the summer of 1980 cement work, including a handicap ramp and new railings were installed outside the main entrance of the church. New outside lighting on the school, hall and convent was installed and electrical updates were made in the rectory.

Fr. Raymond Buhl, pastor from 1945-1971, died on September 5, 1980 with his funeral Mass celebrated here on September 8th.

Fr. Witkowski was transferred in October of 1980 with Fr. James Curtin arriving in December as our new pastor. Fr. Lawrence Pettke was assigned as our associate pastor in 1981. The same year Fr. Sydney Fernandes (Fr. Chico) was assigned on a temporary basis. He left in the summer of 1982.

The dedication of our new Casavant organ was held on May 14, 1982 with a dedicatory recital by our music minister.

The Worship Center Interior Renewal Committee (WCIRC) was formed in 1985 to consider and study the possibility of renovations to the interior of the church. Due to parishioners objecting to proposed changes, the committee was eventually disbanded with no major changes being made.

Fr. Ronald Alder, who was assigned here briefly in 1976, returned as an associate in 1986 when Fr. Larry Pettke was reassigned.

Fr. Joseph Nagaroor, from India, arrived as a new associate in 1988 when Fr. Ron Alder was transferred. Fr. Joseph also ministered to the large Kerala India community in the metropolitan Detroit area.

Skin Cancer Prevention

Anyone can develop skin cancer, but some people are at higher risk than others.

People Most Susceptible to Skin Cancer

1. People with Fair Skin

- People who have:
- Light skin
- Blonde or red hair
- Blue or green eyes
- Skin that freckles or burns easily have less melanin, which provides some protection from UV radiation.

People with High UV Exposure

2. Risk increases for those who:

- Spend a lot of time outdoors for work or recreation
- Live in sunny climates
- Have a history of frequent sunburns, especially during childhood
- Use tanning beds or sunlamps

Older Adults

Skin cancer risk generally rises with age because UV damage accumulates over many years. However, melanoma and other skin cancers can occur in younger people as well.

People with a Personal or Family History of Skin Cancer

Individuals who have had skin cancer before, or who have close relatives with skin cancer, are at increased risk. Genetic factors can contribute to susceptibility.

People with Many Moles or Unusual Moles

Having:

- A large number of moles
- Large moles
- Atypical (dysplastic) moles can increase the risk of melanoma.

People with Weakened Immune Systems

Those who have:

- Received organ transplants
- HIV/AIDS
- Certain medical conditions or medications that suppress immunity may have a higher risk of developing skin cancer.

Important Note

Although fair-skinned individuals have a higher risk, people of all skin tones can develop skin cancer. Skin cancer in people with darker skin may be diagnosed later, making awareness and regular skin checks important for everyone.

How to Lower Risk

- Use broad-spectrum sunscreen.
- Wear protective clothing, hats, and sunglasses.
- Seek shade during peak UV hours.
- Avoid tanning beds.
- Check your skin regularly for new or changing spots

Early Detection

Check your skin regularly and look for:

- New moles or growths
- Changes in the size, shape, or color of existing moles
- Sores that do not heal

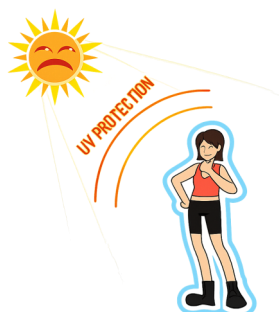
See a healthcare professional if you notice suspicious skin changes. Early detection improves treatment outcomes.

The ABCDE Warning Signs of Melanoma

- A – Asymmetry
- B – Border irregularity
- C – Color variation
- D – Diameter larger than about 6 mm
- E – Evolving (changing over time)

If a mole shows any of these features, have it evaluated by a dermatologist.

Remember: Sun protection is important year-round, not just during summer!

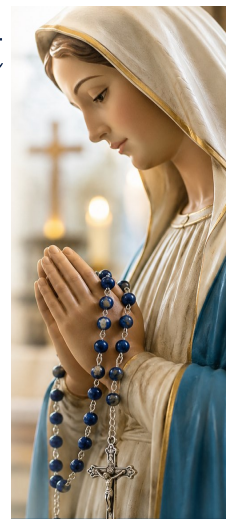
